



1 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

2 Welcome to the Legislature's Parks and Recreation Committee. If we  
3 can all rise for a salute to the flag led by Legislator Bill  
4 Lindsay.

6 (Pledge of Allegiance)

7  
8 Okay. Public Portion. Do we have any cards?

9  
10 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

11 No, ma'am.

12  
13 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

14 There have been no cards submitted to the clerk. Is there anyone  
15 in the audience who would like to speak before this committee?  
16 Seeing none, we will close the public portion. Moving right along  
17 to Appointments.

18  
19 **Introductory Resolution 1495, Appointing Robert G. Keller as a**  
20 **member of the Suffolk County Vanderbilt Museum Commission (Trustee**  
21 **No. 8) (Spencer).** Is Mr. Keller present? Welcome. Come on up.  
22 You can stand at the podium. You can adjust that microphone to  
23 your height. That will make it easier for the stenographer and us  
24 to hear.

25  
26 **MR. KELLER:**

27 Wonderful.

28  
29 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

30 Welcome. Thank you for your willingness to serve.

31  
32 **MR. KELLER:**

33 Well, it's a great honor to be asked to serve on the museum board,  
34 and I would first like to thank you, Chairwoman Hahn, and to  
35 recognize all the legislators here today: Legislator McCaffrey,  
36 Legislator Lindsay, Legislator Trotta, and Presiding Officer  
37 Gregory. I deeply appreciate your consideration for this position  
38 on the Vanderbilt Museum Board. Perhaps I should give you a little  
39 bit of background about myself.

40  
41 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

42 I was going to ask you, but you knew what to do. You've been  
43 briefed.

44  
45 **MR. KELLER:**

46 Okay. I fell in love with the Vanderbilt Museum when I first moved  
47 to Centerport six years ago. I have enjoyed the neighborhood so  
48 much, and the centerpiece of our neighborhood is really the  
49 Vanderbilt Museum, and it's truly one of Long Island's  
50 architectural and educational treasures. From a professional  
51 perspective, shortly after I moved to Centerport in my former  
52 capacity as president of the National Grid Foundation, I had  
53 visited the museum had developed a relationship with the director,  
54 Lance Reinheimer. And we found a great opportunity to sponsor a  
55 program at the museum, which is both close to my heart and very  
56 close to the mission of our foundation, which was education, and in

1 particular STEM education. And the third leg of that stool was I  
2 have a very deep commitment to children from underserved  
3 communities, so what we had done was we created a program to fund  
4 the mobile classroom to go into communities across Suffolk County;  
5 and for me, it was one of the highlights of my career at the  
6 foundation, and I got to see the classroom in action many times at  
7 schools, and the reward for me was looking into the eyes of  
8 children who walked onto that bus and had an opportunity to  
9 experience things that they were never exposed to before. And  
10 although that classroom is not operational any longer, the  
11 planetarium and the museum and some of the other things that the  
12 Vanderbilt offers, I think, is something that we continue to need  
13 to provide to children across Suffolk County to ignite the fire in  
14 their mind to appreciate science and to ensure that we have a  
15 steady and ready workforce for jobs in science, technology,  
16 engineering, and math.

32 **MR. KELLER:**

33 Oh, you mean --

34 **LEG. TROTТА:**

35 Now I'm going to question your --

36 **MR. KELLER:**

37 I thought you were making a sports metaphor.

38 **LEG. TROTТА:**

39 No, no, no; the eagles of Centerport.

40 **MR. KELLER:**

41 I'm sorry. I saw them, perhaps, sooner than anyone else had  
42 because I have a property that's on the water, and they started  
43 nesting in that area probably three plus years ago.

1 **LEG. TROTТА:**

2 No, those are the ospreys. I'm talking about -- you have two bald  
3 --

4  
5 **MR. KELLER:**

6 No, no. I know we have some bald eagles, and I did notice them  
7 there before they were introduced to the community.

8  
9 **LEG. TROTТА:**

10 Really?

11  
12 **MR. KELLER:**

13 Yes.

14  
15 **LEG. TROTТА:**

16 Just for everyone's -- we have two bald eagles in Centerport, and I  
17 go there almost every single day to watch them. Obviously, I have  
18 too much free time.

20 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

21 I want your schedule, Rob. There is a fantastic Facebook page that  
22 has thousands of followers watching the activities of the eagles  
23 and the babies, and it's really a wonderful thing. So any other

25  
26 Did we -- we didn't make a motion. I will make a motion to  
27 approve. Seconded by Legislator Lindsay. All those in favor?  
28 Opposed? Abstentions? **Approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1).**

38 your love of the museum.

11 We'll be happy with the positives we have thus far.

13 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

14 There's been great feedback also from the public on the  
15 concessionaire on all three locations, so we're very happy and  
16 we're moving along.

17

18 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

19 Excellent.

20

21 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

22 For the first year, it's been a seamless transition, which is nice.

23

24 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

25 Good, good, good. They're real pros. Okay. We'll move into --  
26 anyone have any questions for the commissioner while he's here?

28 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

29 I'm here all day.

54 **MR. REINHEIMER:**

55 Lance Reinheimer, executive director of the Vanderbilt Museum. At  
56 the last committee meeting in Riverhead, we discussed this

1 resolution. This resolution, we requested it in anticipation that  
2 there would be construction money in 2019 for the boathouse. The  
3 way the capital program was adopted, we have -- they did not --  
4 there was no money for construction in 2019. They actually put  
5 75,000 for planning in 2019. So the point is this is money that we  
6 can consider next year, so you can table this resolution for the  
7 rest of the year. We don't need these funds. It's duplicated in  
8 2019.

9  
10 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

11 The presiding officer is the sponsor. You can with --

12  
13 **MR. NOLAN:**

14 The county executive has to withdraw it.

15  
16 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

17 The county executive would have to withdraw it, so we should table  
18 for now. Motion to table. Seconded by Legislator Lindsay. All  
19 those in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? 1491 is tabled (VOTE:  
20 **5-0-0-1)**

21  
22 **Introductory Resolution 1508, Authorizing the Department of Parks,**

50 **Introductory Resolution 1605, Authorizing use of Old Field Farm for**  
51 **the Three Village Chamber of Commerce's 19th Annual Family Beach**  
52 **Barbeque (Hahn). I'll make a motion to approve. Seconded by**  
53 **Legislator Lindsay. All in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? 1605 is**  
54 **approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1).**

56 **Introductory Resolution 1621, Appropriating PAYGO funds in**

1 **connection with Computerized Reservation System Point-of-Sale (POS)**  
2 **in County Parks (CP 7169) (County Executive).** Motion to approve.  
3 Second by Legislator McCaffrey. On the motion, Presiding Officer  
4 Gregory.

5  
6 **LEG. GREGORY:**  
7 Actually, never mind.

8  
9 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**  
10 Okay. We have a motion and a second. All in favor? Opposed?  
11 Abstentions? **1621 is approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1)**

12  
13 **Introductory Resolution 1625, Authorizing use of Southaven County**  
14 **Park in Brookhaven by the National Kidney Foundation for its Kidney**  
15 **Awareness Walk Fundraiser (County Executive).** Motion by Legislator  
16 Trotta. Seconded by Legislator Lindsay. All those in favor?  
17 Opposed? Abstentions? **1625 is approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1).**
