3 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

4 All right. Welcome. Are we ready to begin the budget hearing for
5 -- I guess we'll do -- we can do -- are we ready to do Parks --
6 Parks and Recreation first? We'll do that one first. Does it
7 matter? Is there an order that's required? No, okay. We'll do --
8 all rise for a salute to the flag led by Legislator Anker.

9
10 **SALUTATION**

11
12 **PARK & RECREATION**

13
14 Okay. We can begin with Parks and Recreation. And we have the
15 Commissioner here if you'd want to come forward. Good afternoon.
16 How are you, Mr. Berdolt?

17
18 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

19 Good afternoon.

01:36PM

21 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

22 We don't have any cards. Actually I probably should have done this
23 first. Is there anyone in the audience who would like to address
24 the Committee? Seeing none, we will close the public portion.
25 Commissioner -- what's that?

26
27 **MR. REINHEIMER:**

28 I don't know if I'm public or not.

29
30 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

31 Oh, do you want to have your three minutes first? Did you fill out
32 a card?

33
34 **MR. REINHEIMER:**

35 No, I did not.

36
37 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

38 Okay, see? Okay. Phil, do you mind if we just let him, like, give
39 his public portion?

41 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

42 I suppose.

43
44 **PUBLIC PORTION**

45
46 **MR. REINHEIMER:**

47 Thank you.

48
49 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

50 Lance, state your name for the stenographer, please.

01:37PM

51
52 **MR. REINHEIMER:**

53 Lance Reinheimer, Executive Director of the Vanderbilt Museum. I
54 just -- I wasn't sure if you were going to call me or if I'm
55 considered public. I don't mind being considered public. I just
56 have a brief statement.

1 We know the County Executive's recommended budget is out. We know
2 that the museum receives Hotel/Motel tax through the operating
3 budget. And I just want to state on the record that the requested
4 budget understates what the museum requested for Hotel/Motel. We
5 actually requested 1,360,000. The recommended budget says that we
6 requested 1,221,781. That's really all I wanted to say on the
7 record, that it was understated.

8
9 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

01:38PM 10 Excellent. Did you put that in writing in the letter to us?

11
12 **MR. REINHEIMER:**

13 No, I did not.

14
15 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

16 Do that. Thank you.

17
18 **MR. REINHEIMER:**

19 Thank you.

01:38PM 20
21 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

22 Okay. Thank you, Lance Reinheimer. Is there anyone else from the
23 public who would like to speak? Seeing none, we'll close public
24 portion.

25
26 Commissioner, sorry about that.

27
28 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

29 Quite all right.

01:38PM 30
31 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

32 Welcome. Do you have a statement that you would like to give us?

33
34 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

35 I have nothing prepared.

36
37 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

38 Okay. Tell us a little bit about what you think about the
39 operating budget, how it compares to what you requested and what
01:38PM 40 the County Executive offered you.

41
42 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

43 Well, obviously we always request more. And, you know, and we
44 always work with what we have. We do the best we can. There are
45 some lines that were increased so, you know, any shortcomings we
46 might have on some of our other lines, you know, come August, we'll
47 take a look at it for the August updates. Budget Department has
48 been always very good to us as far as -- I mean, you'll note that
49 our temp salaries always come in higher than what we're budgeted.
01:39PM 50 But when they do their housekeeping, there's always enough there to
51 cover that and they are aware of that.

52
53 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

54 How about staffing?

1 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

2 Sorry?

3
4 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

5 Is there staffing for -- your department is always -- I mean you're
6 continually understaffed in all kinds of lines. Is there a
7 particular one that you'd like to bring to our attention?

8
9 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

01:39PM 10 Well, the only thing that we really have problems is the East End
11 and it's also -- it's noted in BRO's review. And it's just -- it's
12 just tough getting people out there, even permanent staff, you
13 know. The people, I guess, on the East End make more than we pay,
14 even if it's in the restaurant business. So that's always
15 difficult.

16
17 We do have three laborers positions that are waiting to be filled
18 and I'm hoping that we can get staff. We've been talking with a
19 lot of our -- you know, our staff we have, say, you know, Middle
01:40PM 20 Island and Sears Bellows and, you know, the temporary help we have
21 and trying to get them to commit to go out east everyday, but it's
22 a lot. It's a lot to -- you know, just the travel time alone to
23 have them go out there. So there are difficulties.

24
25 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

26 Are there issues like just the trail maintenance and, you know,
27 maintenance that's ongoing at every park that we have.

28
29 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

30 There is.

31
32 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

33 I know it's a struggle.

34
35 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

36 And, as you know, we're looking to partner up with other groups to
37 help us out with that. You know, as we acquire more land, it makes
38 it more difficult to keep up with what we have. But when you said
39 partnering up with other people, whether it's Eagle Scout projects
01:41PM 40 or new trail ways or the Greenbelt, everybody is there to help us.
41 And we've been doing okay.

42
43 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

44 But you feel like the positions that the County Executive funded in
45 the budget are sufficient?

46
47 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

48 Yeah. We actually have a few funded positions. I think they
49 funded an extra 13 that we don't have filled so that's a good
01:41PM 50 thing.

51
52 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

53 And you expect to get them all.

54
55 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

56 I hope.

1 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

2 Questions.

3

4 **LEG. TROTТА:**

5 I have a question.

6

7 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

8 Legislator Trotta.

9

10 **LEG. TROTТА:**

11 In the spirit of shared services, have you reached out to, like,
12 the East End towns to see if they could -- we can fund some of
13 their workers to help in our parks?

14

15 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

16 Well, it's funny, we do have -- whether you call it shared services
17 or not, but we have a deal with East Hampton right now. And they
18 plow a lot of our roads out there. And it's my suggestion to take
19 that funding that we pay them to put it towards salaries for some
01:42PM 20 of my help for the East End to get possibly AEOs that I would have
21 full-time that could actually take up the plowing on the East End
22 of the 17 miles of county roads that we have out there. So that's
23 something that we're considering doing.

24

25 **LEG. TROTТА:**

26 That's reversed.

27

28 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

29 Yes, it is.

01:42PM

30

31 **LEG. TROTТА:**

32 Not shared services. That's un-sharing services.

33

34 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

35 But it's taking back our -- you know, it's putting the money back
36 in our pocket.

37

38 **LEG. TROTТА:**

39 Okay. That's all I got.

01:43PM

40

41 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

42 Legislator Krupski; and then Legislator Muratore.

43

44 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

45 Thank you. So I noticed in one of the reports I read that you had
46 struggled finding labor because of minimum wage. But is that --
47 how does that affect your ability to pay people? Because minimum
48 wage continues to go up and you're paying -- how many positions do
49 you have that you have to pay the minimum wage?

01:43PM

50

51 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

52 We just can't find them to work. You know, we can pay them.

53

54 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

55 Oh, okay.

56

1 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

2 But we just can't get anybody to take the full-time position.

3
4 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

5 Roughly how many positions do you have that would pay minimum wage?

6
7 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

8 Right now there are two open East End positions.

9
10 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

11 No, but I mean in total.

12
13 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

14 I'm sorry?

15
16 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

17 In total? In your department, how many would you pay minimum wage?

18
19 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

20 The laborers' position?

21
22 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

23 Any position; whatever else -- any other position that you would --

24
25 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

26 Well, seasonal help is over 400 people.

27
28 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

29 Okay.

30
31 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

32 Permanent help labor positions, I'm thinking, I don't know exact
33 number but I would say we have between 12 and 15 laborers.

34
35 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

36 Okay. And you've been -- you know, Legislator Trotta brought up
37 shared services. And I know Cedar Beach is always an issue because
38 of the garbage there and enforcement. And I just want to mention,
39 though, that Orient Fire Department did a water rescue in April.

40 And a boat sank at Plum Gut. Luckily it wasn't the Presiding
41 Officer's boat recently. And they did a water rescue and they had
42 difficulty getting -- accessing the water through the County park.
43 And I have to say Commissioner Berdolt was very responsive. And
44 that road was cleaned up and made passable very quickly and they
45 were very happy because that's a major access point for -- in an
46 emergency. So I just want to thank you for that.

47
48 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

49 And also our thanks to the Orient Ferry Company for allowing us to
50 use the RCA, which was great that they had stockpiled onsite. So a
51 little bit of shared services.

52
53 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

54 There's a little shared services going on, year.

1 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

2 A little bit.

3

4 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

5 Thank you.

6

7 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

8 Legislator Muratore.

9

10 **LEG. MURATORE:**

11 Thank you, Madam Chair. Hi, Commissioner, how are you?

12

13 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

14 Very well. How are you, sir?

15

16 **LEG. MURATORE:**

17 Good. On illegal dumping sites, has any money been budgeted to
18 take care of the illegal dumping sites in the budget?

19

20 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

21 Right now, yes. We have \$750,000.

22

23 **LEG. MURATORE:**

24 Are there other funds available? Is there anything through the
25 federal government or through the state that we can get monies for
26 these cleanups?

27

28 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

29 Not that I'm aware of offhand. I can look into it, though.

01:45PM

30

31 **LEG. MURATORE:**

32 Any fines or penalties if we apprehend the culprits that do illegal
33 dumping, does that come back to the Parks Department budget or does
34 it go into the County General Fund or where does that money go?

35

36 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

37 I would assume it goes into the General Fund.

38

39 **LEG. MURATORE:**

01:46PM

40 Okay, great. Thank you.

41

42 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

43 Legislator Fleming.

44

45 **LEG. FLEMING:**

46 Thank you. Hi, Phil.

47

48 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

49 How are you?

01:46PM

50

51 **LEG. FLEMING:**

52 Thank you for being here. And thank you for all your excellent
53 work as Commissioner of Parks. It's obviously a very important
54 part of our district. And I you know you're completely
55 understaffed there and yet you seem to always be very responsive to
56 the needs and concerns of the public. So thank you for that.

1 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

2 Thank you.

3
4 **LEG. FLEMING:**

5 With regard to the difficulty in hiring, is there any way -- I
6 mean, obviously, it's one of the reasons why it's so important to
7 get affordable housing in the East End and why we've got to try to
8 solve our public transportation problems. I mean, there's a
9 combination of an impossibly expensive housing market and a very
01:46PM 10 difficult commute that make it, you know, just doesn't make sense
11 to make \$11 an hour to work there. But is there a possibility of
12 somehow reframing the way we use the housing, the Parks housing to
13 make it like a combined offer to get -- to sort of incentivize
14 people to work there?
15

16 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

17 Well, as you know, over at Third House we do have -- besides the
18 cabins that are there, we do rent them out occasionally to people
19 from Deep Wells Ranch. But adjacent or attached to Third House
01:47PM 20 there are four hotel units that, you know, when we broke open a
21 couple of walls to accommodate SoulGrow who is no longer there. So
22 that's a possibility. I don't know. We'd have to check with
23 legal and, you know, if -- how is that -- is that considered a
24 salary, you know, to give housing.
25

26 **LEG. FLEMING:**

27 Right.

28
29 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

01:47PM 30 It's something that I haven't crossed a line on yet or looked into
31 it because, you know, it's something I would like to do.
32

33 **LEG. FLEMING:**

34 Yes.

35
36 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

37 But is it legal, you know, would we be scrutinized for it, I don't
38 know, I'd have to look into it, but it's definitely an option.
39

40 **LEG. FLEMING:**

41 Well, we'll work with you on it. We'll see if we can do something
42 in that vein.
43

44 The other question I have for you is the Big Duck inventory. Are
45 you aware of a reduction in the inventory line for the Big Duck;
46 and could we get an explanation?
47

48 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

01:48PM 49 Yes, it's also for the St. James General Store. So it's the two of
50 them to get combined. Like I said, also, you know, when we do our
51 August updates is when we'll look. And if we need to transfer more
52 funds over because it is a revenue-generating operation, so I'm not
53 too concerned about it.
54

55 **LEG. FLEMING:**

56 I didn't see your request. Did that happen at the recommended

1 stage? Did your request include a reduction or -- I think is it
2 zeroing out the inventory line for the Big Duck?

3
4 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
5 No, no, it just reduced it.

6
7 **LEG. FLEMING:**
8 Okay. Was that in your request or was that done at the County
9 Executive level?

01:49PM 10
11 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
12 No, it was done at the County Executive.

13
14 **LEG. FLEMING:**
15 But you're saying that you're -- have you looked at how it impacts
16 the contract with the Friends of the Big Duck and the inventory
17 that they sell out of the Duck?

18
19 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
01:49PM 20 Well, it's not the Friends of the Big Duck. It's actually the
21 County that operates both the General Store and the Big Duck.

22
23 **LEG. FLEMING:**
24 No, I understand that, but there's a relationship there where the
25 County employee who's in the Duck also works with the Friends of
26 the Big Duck on the little museum that we created and --

27
28 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
29 Okay.

01:49PM 30
31 **LEG. FLEMING:**
32 You know, there's a relationship there. So I would be concerned
33 that it not adversely impact that group.

34
35 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
36 Yeah, I don't think one will have anything to do with the other for
37 operational purposes.

38
39 **LEG. FLEMING:**
01:50PM 40 Well, I thought if you reduce the inventory, it was going to reduce
41 what was going to be sold out of that tourist site; isn't that --

42
43 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
44 Correct. So it may have an impact on tourism.

45
46 **LEG. FLEMING:**
47 Right, yeah.

48
49 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
01:50PM 50 Through it.

51
52 **LEG. FLEMING:**
53 Okay.

54
55 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
56 But, like I said, you know, we always -- you know, we always do our

1 August updates and see how we are and what lines. And then we do a
2 lot of transferring around either for equipment or whatever, you
3 know, we do a lot of our own in-housekeeping. And, you know, we
4 have no problem as we have in the past increased that line.

5
6 **LEG. FLEMING:**

7 No, but I'm worried if in spring and summer they're not able to
8 restock their shelves with, you know, what they sell out of that
9 site, it may impact -- it's a very important tourist destination in
10 Flanders.

01:51PM

11
12 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

13 No, I understand. I think they were just recently stocked and, you
14 know, we still have for this year. So I think they'll be okay.

15
16 **LEG. FLEMING:**

17 Okay. All right. Thank you.

18
19 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

20 Legislator Anker.

01:51PM

21
22 **LEG. ANKER:**

23 I want to thank you for all the work that you've done with our
24 parks because I think isn't the recreational monies 2% of our
25 budget? Isn't it large; fairly large or no, am I wrong? Maybe
26 not.

27
28 So I wanted to just put on your radar the idea of using our parks
29 to generate, I think, you said revenue earning funds so we can
30 continue to provide, especially with our tourism folks, incentive
31 to come back to Suffolk County and also for the residents that are
32 there locally. Are we using types of sponsorships in our parks;
33 and if we are, what types of sponsorships are we doing?

01:51PM

34
35 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

36 Revenue-generating sponsorships? No, we are not.

37
38 **LEG. ANKER:**

39 You know, I'm thinking, again, partnering with a company that does
40 kayaking or -- what is the boards that they stand on?

01:52PM

41
42 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

43 All of that we do. We put that out every year. And it's more of a
44 concession than a sponsorship.

45
46 **LEG. ANKER:**

47 Okay.

48
49 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

50 Kayaks, paddle boards, things like that.

01:52PM

51
52 **LEG. ANKER:**

53 So do we earn money on that?

54
55 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

56 Yes.

1 **LEG. ANKER:**

2 Okay, that's good. That's what I was wondering. As far as
3 signage, things like that, you know, sponsorships with cleaning up,
4 you know, like we have with our DPW, do we do that?

5
6 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

7 Right. No, signage we do not. I don't know if we can. I know
8 that we did put it in for the golf courses because they're run by
9 concessionaire; and that we had it in our last increase in fees,
01:52PM 10 and we added that in, that if somebody wants to sponsor a tee, they
11 could. But other than that, I mean, like, you know, if you go to
12 Duck Stadium, which is different, it's run by the Ducks and it's
13 managed by DPW, up against their outer wall, there's all kinds of
14 sponsorship, but we do not have that.

15
16 **LEG. ANKER:**

17 And, again, I know there's a fine line between being intrusive with
18 signage and then adjoining our open space. But I think there's
19 still, you know, some pretty good potential maybe to tap into some
01:53PM 20 of those opportunities. Since we do own the land, we have to
21 maintain the land. And, you know, it can be expensive.

22
23 The other concern I have, and, again, possibly dealing with the
24 financial implications of our parks is erosion. I know certain
25 places in my area have lost 30 feet of property on the cliffs.
26 This one is in Miller Place, but we do have Chandler Estate,
27 Cordwood Landing, I know there's a number of some areas going
28 towards out east, Wading River; and we went to a -- Legislator Hahn
29 and I attended a erosion meeting. Maybe we can partner with Stony
01:54PM 30 Brook to see what we can do to address this issue. It's not only
31 affecting our parks and losing this -- losing this valuable
32 property, but also affecting our residents. Thank you.

33
34 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

35 Okay.

36
37 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

38 Legislator Krupski.

39
40 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

41 So I was reading the part about the revenue here and it was up kind
42 of predictably on the golf course this year, but considerably down
43 on pools and beaches. And that was after a extremely hot summer.

44
45 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

46 But a rainy summer on the weekends. It rained at least one day
47 every weekend.

48
49 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

01:54PM 50 So you think the 300,000 would be less day passes?

51
52 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

53 Parking.

54
55 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

56 Oh, parking fees, okay. Because it was -- it couldn't have been

1 hotter so you think people would -- do you charge in the evening;
2 people go after work.

3
4 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

5 Well, understand that the way our fee structure is set, most people
6 can get into our parks during the week for free.

7
8 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

9 Okay.

01:55PM 10

11 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

12 If you're a veteran, volunteer fireman, whether you're handicapped.
13 And if it rains on the weekends, you know, you lose one day of
14 revenue at one park, at Smith Point, could be \$50,000.

15
16 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

17 Okay. It did rain every weekend.

01:55PM 18

19 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

20 It rained at least one day about every weekend.

21
22 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

23 Sure, sure. All right. And the other thing was the -- there's a
24 mention of a concession at the North Fork Preserve, what would that
25 mean?

26
27 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

28 Yeah, I'm not sure.

29
30 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

31 I don't know who to ask.

32
33 **MS. HALLORAN:**

34 I think that was that equestrian related for the piece of property
35 that --

36
37 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

38 Cattle?

39
40 **MS. HALLORAN:**

41 Yes.

42
43 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

44 Oh, okay.

45
46 **MS. HALLORAN:**

47 Farm-related, I should say, yes.

48
49 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

50 Okay. Well, we're still --

51
52 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

53 -- working on it.

54
55 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

56 Okay. Thank you.

1 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

2 Any other questions? Okay. Thank you.

3
4 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

5 I'd just like to also say one other thing that -- and I'm sure,
6 Legislator Trotta, you'll enjoy this, that we are doing design
7 in-house now for Cupsogue. So we are --

8
9 **LEG. TROTTA:**

10 Shocking.

11
12 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

13 -- working on it. I already have a preliminary plan.

14
15 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

16 So we should probably have a working group that meets about that.
17 So we have input before you get started.

18
19 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

20 So we do have -- there was -- you know, there was still some money
21 left in our planning phase which we'll put towards construction.
22 So make everybody happy. So I've been working with the architects
23 over in Public Works. We have a preliminary design. I showed it
24 to the concessionaire there for his input on the kitchen design.
25 And that's it. We're trying to keep it within a certain budget.
26 And so little things like that.

27
28 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

29 Good. I think there's a number of us on this horseshoe that would
30 be interested in having early input.

31
32 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

33 Well, I'm sure it will be awhile, but, yes.

34
35 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

36 Thank you for mentioning it. Legislator Fleming.

37
38 **LEG. FLEMING:**

39 So to what extent is the community involved in that discussion?

40
41 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

42 So far there has been no involvement by anybody other than myself
43 and Public Works.

44
45 **LEG. FLEMING:**

46 Because, as you know, there's a great deal of interest in the
47 community. And we did have a meeting at one point, but we're going
48 to get a lot of adverse feed back if you go too far down the road
49 with a design without including the community members who care so
50 much about that location.

51
52 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

53 Yeah, yeah. I mean, given the budget, this isn't going to be a,
54 you know, a three-story Taj Mahal, you know, obviously --

1 **LEG. FLEMING:**

2 Well, no matter it is, I mean there are people to whom that is a
3 really important place --

4
5 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

6 Right.

7
8 **LEG. FLEMING:**

9 -- you know, who live in the area and community advisory
01:57PM 10 committees, the civic organizations. I mean, I would ask that you
11 at least have a meeting with those folks to talk about what you're
12 going to do before you move too far down the road.

13
14 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

15 Okay. Sure.

16
17 **LEG. FLEMING:**

18 I'd be happy to help.

19
20 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

21 Definitely want to be a part of that. It's been -- it's a longtime
22 overdue to rethink it, but we do have to be careful. Okay.
23 Legislator Anker.

24
25 **LEG. ANKER:**

26 One other thought as far as relating to our finances, and it's
27 something, again, I know Kara has been working a lot on this, is
28 the illegal dumping. Are you working with our Suffolk County PD
29 and maybe state to address DEC to address the illegal dumping going
01:58PM 30 on in the parks?

31
32 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

33 Well, we just received some trail cams so we're looking to put them
34 out in a few of the parks.

35
36 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

37 Finally.

38
39 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

01:58PM 40 Yeah. So far it's like, thank God knock on wood, it's been
41 relatively quiet. Things have been good. Maybe just the air time
42 everything's getting and with what the DAs been doing and catching
43 these guys dumping and illegal trucking, it's been pretty good. I
44 mean, you know, our biggest concerns are the neighbors, you know,
45 what they throw over the fence or encroachment on our property.

46
47 So since then, I mean even that one area, I think, where they were
48 cutting through, that's kind of quieted down. We have a great task
49 force that goes out every weekend. That's a joint task force for
01:59PM 50 our ATV patrol, off-road vehicle patrol, motorcycles in all of the
51 areas. We work with the Sheriff's Department, Suffolk County PD,
52 New York State Park Police; also State Park Police and the State
53 Police. And we go out sometimes 25 strong and coordinate and go to
54 different areas that we see this get a lot of activity. So maybe
55 all of that combined has really put the word out to properties.

1 **LEG. ANKER:**

2 How many cameras? How many cameras are out right now?

3
4 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

5 None are out; none are deployed. I just got the word from the PD
6 and we're going to start to set them up.

7
8 **LEG. ANKER:**

9 Now these are the hidden cameras; are they visual that people know
02:00PM 10 that they're being watched?

11
12 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

13 I haven't -- well, I haven't actually seen them. But it's a trail
14 cam so it goes in a tree, whether it's camouflaged, I'm sure it is.
15 I don't know. Legislator Krupski might know.

16
17 **LEG. ANKER:**

18 Are we going to have -- are we going to have signs letting people
19 know that there's cameras in the woods? Because I just want to --
02:00PM 20 we don't want to -- no, you're saying no.

21
22 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

23 No.

24
25 **LEG. ANKER:**

26 I mean we don't want to infringe on their privacy but, of course,
27 we don't want these people to steal or vandalize the properties.
28 That's something you may want to think of to put a sign so we don't
29 get sued or there's no litigation involving, you know --

02:00PM 30
31 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

32 Well, it's not going to be -- it's not going to be a thing that
33 anybody can watch in real time. It's a digital camera that takes
34 rapid photos. And it'll only take when there's motion in front of
35 it. So, we'll only go and look if something has happened.

36
37 **LEG. ANKER:**

38 Right. You may want to consider, I know this is kind of strange,
39 but they have the -- certain not-for-profits have these live shots
02:01PM 40 of, like, baby eagles and things like that. And they've got
41 millions of hits globally. So, again, something to think about;
42 maybe there's -- you know, to make money and appreciate what we
43 have here in Suffolk County with our wildlife. So, thank you.

44
45 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

46 Okay.

47
48 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

49 Again, thank you for your time and all that you do.

02:01PM 50
51 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

52 Thank you.

53
54 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

55 Thankful for your work and the work of all your employees that work
56 so hard.

1 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

2 And I have to say my staff is excellent. Everybody. Seasonals and
3 all the office staff.

4
5 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

6 Yeah.

7
8 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

9 They haven't been getting a great rap lately from certain things
10 that were put out, but I have to defend them, say they're all doing
11 a great job.

12
13 **ENVIRONMENT, PLANNING & AGRICULTURE**

14
15 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

16 Thank you. Okay. So next we have Environment, Planning and
17 Agriculture. Director Lansdale, if you want to come forward and --
18 is Frank coming up with you?

19
20 **DIRECTOR LANSDALE:**

21 Only, if we need him.

22
23 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

24 Only if we need him. Welcome. All right, everybody, we're
25 switching over to Environment, Planning and Agriculture. Good
26 afternoon, Director Lansdale. Do you have a statement? No?

27
28 **DIRECTOR LANSDALE:**

29 I don't have anything. I'll be happy to answer any question.

30
31 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

32 Is there anything you'd like to tell us about the difference
33 between your requests and what County Executive submitted; anything
34 you'd like to highlight?

35
36 **DIRECTOR LANSDALE:**

37 No, not at this time.

38
39 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

40 Do we have any questions for Director Lansdale? No. Legislator
41 Anker.

42
43 **LEG. ANKER:**

44 Just want to thank Sarah and your department for all the work that
45 you've done. I know there's an article in Newsday today about land
46 acquisition in Middle Island. And, again, if it wasn't for your
47 department and all the folks that are involved, greatly appreciate
48 the work. Thank you.

49
50 **DIRECTOR LANSDALE:**

51 Thank you. I want to take this opportunity to thank my entire team
52 for the hard work that they do each and every day.

53
54 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

55 Okay. Anything more anyone want to -- anything you can tell us
56 about staff and 477 funds this time around. I know that that

1 particular line and it's used in staffing, I know it's across
2 departments, but I'm sorry that I'm only asking you and I didn't
3 ask Phil.

4
5 **DIRECTOR LANSDALE:**

6 Not at all. I know that this topic was covered a little bit
7 yesterday during the budget hearing during Health. And I do want
8 to thank, and we appreciate the Legislature's recommendation. We
9 met -- Peter Scully met with a number of Legislators over the
02:04PM 10 summer when we were talking about how we could access the \$10
11 million in funding from New York State to upgrade septic systems
12 and the funding sources that we could use to hire staff. And
13 rather than proposing to create nine positions, we went back at the
14 request and at the advice of Legislators whom we identified as many
15 vacant positions that were already funded through the 477 as we
16 could. So, we took a hard look at that and we appreciate your
17 advice.

18
19 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

02:05PM 20 Thank you. Okay. That's it. Presiding Officer Gregory.

21
22 **P.O. GREGORY:**

23 I want to thank Sarah, also, for the job that her department does.
24 I'm really fond of you. I think you do a tremendous job. You're
25 very -- if I had a favorite, you're my favorite. (Laughter) No,
26 seriously. And I hate to say it because I don't want to put anyone
27 else on the spot, but I think you're really professional and you're
28 really attentive to questions and our needs. And I really think
29 you exemplify what county employees should be and you're top-notch.
02:06PM 30 So thank you.

31
32 **DIRECTOR LANSDALE:**

33 Thank you so much.

34
35 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

36 I think we all agree Director Lansdale and her staff do a
37 tremendous amount of work. And she always has the answers to the
38 questions and anticipates them and is really on top of everything
39 that's going on in a whole host, a variety of areas. And it's
02:06PM 40 quite impressive so thank you, Presiding Officer. I don't think
41 any of us could have said it any better. We very much appreciate
42 you and your staff and all that you do. The planning arena, the
43 environmental protection arena, economic development, you know, all
44 kinds of areas that you help us with.

45
46 Anyone else like to praise Sarah? All right. Well, with that I
47 believe -- with that I believe we are adjourned. Thank you.
