(The meeting was called to order at 12:43 p.m.)

CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:

Hello, everybody. Welcome to the Legislature's Parks and Recreation committee. If we could all rise for a salute to the flag led by Legislator Berland.

(Pledge of Allegiance)

CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:

Public portion. We have three cards. If there is anyone in the audience who would like to speak and hasn't filled out a card, you can get one from the clerk and fill it out.

First we have Joseph Kukral. I always get it wrong.

MR. KUKRAL:

You got it right.

CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:

I did? Okay. I always question myself.

MR. KUKRAL:

Very good. No, you got it right. Joe Kukral with Suffolk Committee for camping. It was recently brought to our attention, as a board member of SCC, a reference to local law that we're asking for some assistance in basically just change of verbiage. The best that I could find from what was sent to me, it's called "The Administrative Code of Suffolk County." Like I said, we're only asking to update some of the verbiage in there, and I have the law here that I can quote to you, but it was recently brought to our attention because at a local campground, a camper, a member of SCC either knew or found out that the person next to them was a registered sex offender; and in New York law, all sex offenders are required to register with the state, but only level two and three are required to notify park rangers of their stay in a campground.

So in the verbiage, and this is the way that I researched it, the administrative code, chapter A, and it's under paragraph two, "Regulatory Local Laws," chapter 745, Sex Offenders, part five, which is "Use of County Parks," was adopted on 11/22/2011 by Local Law number 1-2012, Article 6, Reporting Requirements, subsection 745-28, Legislative Intent. I'm not going to read the whole paragraph because only the last line, we're looking for verbiage change.

It says, "This Legislature finds that to ensure the safety if all campers on county park property, registered sex offenders shall inform the Suffolk County park police of their sex offender status at the time of their check-in at any county campsite." The next paragraph says, "Therefore, the purpose of this part five is to require registered sex offenders to notify, again, Suffolk County park police of their sex offender status upon check-in at any overnight facility on county parkland." Then we skip to subsection 745-30, which is "Disclosure Requirements." "Any resident who

1 reserves space or stays overnight on any Suffolk County campground
2 shall report his or her sex offender status to the Suffolk County
3 park police prior to or at the time of his or her arrival at the
4 campground. The sex offender shall also notify the park police of
5 the scheduled duration of his or her stay at the campground."
6

7 All we're asking that, since we haven't had park police in four
8 years now, that this get changed from "Suffolk County park police"
9 to "Suffolk County rangers." And speaking to the park rangers'
10 office on Monday, right now they only have one gentleman that is
11 reporting to them because he's homeless so he moves from campground
12 to campground, been doing it for a couple years, so he knew enough
13 to stay with the program. But right now there's nothing that says
14 "park rangers," and currently that's what it is.
15

16 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

17 Sounds reasonable. I'm just going to talk to Counsel here.
18

19 **LEG. TROTТА:**

20 Suffolk County police do it.
21

22 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

23 Suffolk County police. The parks police was incorporated into the
24 police department, and they became police officers, so I don't know
25 if that would mean right now that they have to inform the police
26 department at the moment or is it just --
27

28 **MR. NOLAN:**

29 If they were going to report to anybody, it would be to their
30 successor, which would be the park rangers. I think I would talk
31 to the Parks department; whether or not that would be a solution, I
32 don't know what the Parks Department is doing now. Maybe that's an
33 issue we could talk to the commissioner about at some point: What
34 are they doing now in terms of sex offenders giving notification of
35 their status.
36

37 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

38 Okay. So when we are done with the public portion, we'll have the
39 commissioner come up, and he'll address this.
40

41 **MR. KUKRAL:**

42 Thank you.
43

44 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

45 Thank you. Thanks for all your work, Joe.
46

47 Next speaker, Jeffrey Klein.
48

49 **MR. KLEIN:**

50 Thank you. My name is Jeffrey Miles Klein. I'm here with my
51 wonderful wife Elaine. We are married for 53 years.
52

53 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

54 Congratulations.
55

56 **MR. KLEIN:**

1 We own a home in Centereach for 47 years. We have four sons and
2 nine grandchildren.

3
4 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

5 Jeffrey, excuse me. Would you mind just making sure you are
6 speaking into the mike because it's not picking up.

7
8 **MR. KLEIN:**

9 Can you hear me now?

10
11 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

12 Now we can hear you.

13
14 **MR. KLEIN:**

15 Want me to repeat that?

16
17 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

18 No, we heard that.

19
20 **MR. KLEIN:**

21 Both my wife and I are former Suffolk County employees. I was an
22 assistant county attorney for 10 years. My wife worked for the
23 Department of Health for 18 years. We have two wonderful Old
24 English sheep dogs that are therapy dogs. One is nine; the other
25 is going on eight. This last year has been a very difficult year
26 for us because my wife was diagnosed with colorectal cancer in
27 March. She was just recently operated in May successfully. We've
28 had these difficulties. She has a bad knee. She has a handicapped
29 sticker. We need to exercise our dogs and ourselves. Recently, I

30 was walking the dog around our neighborhood, which we've
31 experienced fast driving cars, motorcycles, bicycles that the dogs
32 sometimes try to chase, but they are always on a leash. A
33 neighbor's house had a dog that escaped from it. It tried to
34 attack one of our dogs. My dog pulled me down. I chipped my
35 tooth. We've tried to go to various dog walks. We don't like dog
36 parks because dogs there are too aggressive. We went to a park in
37 Nesconset, where we went for almost a year, and because of an
38 incident there, we were almost arrested by a park ranger due to
39 some disgruntled Smithtown resident who claimed that, because we
40 weren't Smithtown residents, we should get the hell out of there
41 and we should not be allowed in there and he would call the park
42 ranger, which, on this one particular occasion, he did and they had
43 the animal control come down and she threatened to summons us for
44 trespassing, illegal parking, and in an effort to find a suitable
45 place where we could walk our dogs in safety, I have been looking
46 around. We've stayed out of that Nesconset park, but I have been
47 looking around.

48
49 We need some place that's shaded because these dogs have a heavy
50 coat. We need a place that's paved, that's free of ticks, free of
51 branch roots that come out of the ground, that's level. There was
52 a place in Farmingville I looked at but they had gullies that were
53 30 feet deep. To my surprise, after living in Centereach for all
54 this time, I went to Raynor Park and found that Raynor Park is
55 little used. It has paved paths, it's got shade, and nobody uses
56 it. I personally walked the park myself one morning without the

1 dogs. Didn't see anybody. The only problem I have been told is
2 that there's a playground there, but the playground is a couple
3 blocks away from this paved area. We would like the opportunity to
4 walk our dogs there. We've been told about all other parks, which
5 I've explored. They're too far from our home. They don't meet
6 those characteristics, and here's a wonderful park that nobody is
7 using that we think we should be allowed to use it. It could be
8 used if signs were posted, if a couple wastebaskets were there, and
9 the signage should be that heavy fines would be imposed if people
10 leave dog waste there and don't leash their dogs.

12 I have been trying to get a hold of legislators. Few are
13 sympathetic with me; however, I ran into the county executive over
14 a year ago. He said, Mail me. I did send him a letter over a year
15 ago. I've gotten no response to that letter. I have called his
16 office. I've gotten little response. One of his aides had called
17 me back and --

18
19 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

20 Okay. Your time is up, but are you asking for access to Raynor
21 Park for dogs?

23 **MR. KLEIN:**

24 Yes.

25
26 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

27 Okay. And Raynor Park is a Town of Brookhaven park; you know that?

28
29 **MR. BERDOLT:**

30 It's county.

32 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

33 County? Oh, I'm sorry. There's a Raynor Park on 347. We're not
34 talking about the same one?

35
36 **MR. KLEIN:**

37 No.

38
39 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

40 Sorry. I was thinking of the one that's right around the corner
41 from you, which is on 347 in Setauket. That's also Raynor Park,
42 and that's a town park.

44 **MR. KLEIN:**

45 I also have a copy of this letter that I would like to share with
46 the committee. How many copies would you need?

47
48 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

49 We'll make the copies. So there are paved pathways at Raynor?

51 **MR. KLEIN:**

52 It's paved for about a mile or two. It's a wide, paved park that's
53 unused.

54
55 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

56 And you'll also be excited that the Rails to Trails project is

1 moving forward. That will be paved and levelled for 11 miles.
2 Dogs will be allowed on the Rails to Trails.

3
4 **MR. KLEIN:**
5 Where is that?

6
7 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**
8 It hasn't been built yet, but we just approved the funding, and
9 it's going to start in Port Jeff Station-Mount Sinai area on
10 Crystal Brook Hollow Road.

12 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**
13 Not that far.

14
15 **MR. KLEIN:**
16 Well, this is probably a mile, a mile and a half from our house.
17 It's ideal. We would like to see some giveback by the county for
18 people such as us who have lived here for 47 years, have been
19 employed by the county. It's time that logic prevails.

21 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**
22 Thank you.

23
24 **LEG. TROTТА:**
25 Does he know about Blydenburgh right across the street? Did you
26 talk about that? There's a dog run in there.

27
28 **MR. KLEIN:**
29 Yes. We had one dog years ago, and Old English sheep dog as well,
30 that was bitten at Blydenburgh Park. People go to Blydenburgh
31 Park, they get out of their SUVs, their dogs run around. If the
32 dog attacks another dog, they jump in their SUVs and you're faced
33 with a thousand or \$2,000 veterinary bill.

35 **LEG. TROTТА:**
36 You just want to be able to walk your dog in a park in a park not a
37 dog park?

38
39 **MR. KLEIN:**
40 Yeah. We don't want to go to dog parks anymore. What my sister in
41 law just experienced, a collie, whose dog's ear was half bitten off
42 in Wisconsin at a dog park. We don't like dog parks.

44 **LEG. TROTТА:**
45 Maybe through the chair, when the commissioner comes up, it might
46 be okay to walk your dog in Raynor Park already. I'm not sure.

47
48 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**
49 You're not.

50
51 **LEG. TROTТА:**
52 Never mind.

53
54 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**
55 But when the commissioner comes up, we'll ask him why. Thank you.

1 **MR. KLEIN:**

2 And the other thing, I just want to -- one last thing I would like
3 to express. Brookhaven doesn't allow dogs usually to be in their
4 parks. Suffolk County does. This seems to be the one exception
5 and I'd like to know why this park is different from all other
6 Suffolk County parks or most other Suffolk County parks where you
7 can walk your dogs.

8
9 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

10 Thank you.

11
12 Elaine Klein. You'll have three minutes.

13
14 **MR. KLEIN:**

15 Hi. I just want to say I echo the same thing my husband just said
16 about the parks. We don't like dog parks because of incidents, and
17 we just want to walk our two great dogs in Raynor Park. And we've
18 noticed driving by on a number of occasions, there's nobody there;
19 maybe there's just a few children at the park, but that's not near
20 the trail. So all we want is to be able to walk our dogs, you
21 know, both of them. They're therapy dogs. They're Old English
22 sheep dogs, and they are getting older now, and we want to be able
23 to walk them and give them exercise and also for ourselves. Thank
24 you.

25
26 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

27 Thank you.

28
29 That is the last card that we had today. Is there anyone else in
30 the audience who would like to address the legislature? Seeing
31 none, we will close the public portion, and we can bring up the
32 commissioner. We have a couple questions.

33
34 So let's start with the sex offenders; that issue came up first.
35 Joe Kukral mentioned the law, reading that they must report to
36 parks police. Are you aware of this issue, and --

37
38 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

39 No, not until Joe brought it to my attention.

40
41 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

42 Okay. It seems like an easy fix.

43
44 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

45 Whether it needs to be rewritten or not --

46
47 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

48 So at the moment, they should be reporting to the rangers, but
49 we'll clarify that and codify that clarification, but that should
50 be the expectation is that they are reporting to --

51
52 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

53 We're only getting the one person who reports. I don't know if
54 there are more in there or not. Maybe it's something we can work
55 with Suffolk County PD or wherever the sex offenders are supposed
56 to report, whether it's probation and find out -- get into the

1 database that way so we'll cross.

2

3 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

4 Yeah, cross check. Okay. Thank you. So we'll be on top of that.
5 Thank you for bringing it to our attention.

6

7 And then next, Raynor Park.

8

9 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

12:58PM 10 Raynor Park, yes. There are two places we don't allow dogs. Ne is
11 Raynor Park and the other are on our beaches where there are
12 lifeguards, mainly for the reason that -- where I appreciate the
13 Kleins may be one of the few exceptions that they pick up after
14 their dog, they keep them leashed, that's not always the case. As
15 a lot of legislators know, in your districts, we get calls all the
16 time. All of our parks, we allow dogs. So if you do go to
17 Blydenburgh, you don't necessarily have to go into the dog park,
18 which is an off-leash section of the park. All of our parks there
19 are miles and miles of trails that you can walk your dog on a
12:59PM 20 leash.

21

22 So the reason also at Raynor is that the ball fields are there, the
23 playgrounds, and the waste that was being found by the playground
24 throughout the years -- this is prior to my tenure -- was
25 overwhelming and the ball fields were littered with either holes or
26 dog waste, and that's the reason why. Right across the street, we
27 have our Ronkonkoma Lake Park; there are dogs allowed there around
28 the lake. Now we just added the Bavarian Inn site, which is a nice
29 spot. We did do a pathway through there, so there are other places
01:00PM 30 in the vicinity that do allow dogs.

31

32 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

33 Is Raynor Park staffed?

34

35 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

36 It is not. I mean, it's staffed by the people from Lake
37 Ronkonkoma, but there isn't staff based there. When things need to
38 get done, they just come across the street from our maintenance
39 building at Lake Ronkonkoma, so it's not like there's a fixed group
01:00PM 40 there every day. It's a roving crew.

41

42 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

43 Right. No, I mean, I could -- so who tells them not to have their
44 dog?

45

46 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

47 Well, it's not like we're there waiting. If something happens or
48 if they just happen to go through and they see somebody with a dog,
49 which it happens all the time, we just tell them they're not
01:00PM 50 allowed to have a dog in the park.

51

52 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

53 So, I mean, could there be -- could there be that they're only
54 allowed on the paved walking trail and not anywhere else?

55

56 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

1 It could, but it just doesn't work.

2

3 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

4 But aren't these service dogs? Their dogs are service dogs, so
5 they would have to be allowed --

6

7 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

8 Maybe there's are, but the rest of the people, how are you going to
9 --

11 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

12 No, but I guess my question, which we didn't ask them, but if they
13 are service dogs, then they are allowed anywhere. Even where dogs
14 are not allowed, people are allowed to bring a service dog.

15

16 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

17 Well, there's service and there's therapy. I don't know the extent
18 of their -- of what they are.

19

21 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

22 Okay.

23

24 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

25 I mean, we have plenty of places throughout the entire county.

26

27 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

28 But do you have -- do we have other paved trails that are similar
29 to this one? I can't think of one off the top of my head that
might be close by.

31 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

32 Well, right across the street is Lake Ronkonkoma. It's a paved
33 path right around the entire perimeter of the property. There's a
34 walking path that goes around and now we extended it past the
35 parking lot all the way in the Bavarian Inn. I mean, there are.

36

37 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

38 Thank you. Okay. Does anyone else have any questions for the
39 commissioner while he's here?

01:02PM 40

41 West Hills, can you give us an update --

42

43 **MR. KLEIN:**

44 Can I say something?

45

46 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

47 No, I'm sorry, sir. Public portion is over.

48

49 **MR. KLEIN:**

50 I just want to --

51

52 **CHIARWOMAN HAHN:**

53 No. No, I'm sorry, sir. Public portion is over. You can
54 certainly meet with us after the committee, you can talk to the
55 commissioner after the committee, but the public portion is over
56 now.

1 So do you have an update on West Hills? I saw something that came
2 over.

3
4 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

5 They did go back to court. There was a discrepancy in some of the
6 material. There are three types of material that are there, and
7 they are designated by color code; and I'm not positive on the
8 color, but say the yellow material, there was an issue on where its
9 final resisting place would be, and that's been worked out but the
01:03PM 10 court did demand that work get started immediately, so we've been
11 working on finalizing the excavation plan, that it went back to
12 them now excluding the yellow material, that they will start on the
13 two other types of material until they can get that part worked
14 out. They are going back to court, but I don't know the exact date
15 of that to finalize the last of that material where it's final
16 resisting place would go.

17
18 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

19 Do you mind if I read this into the record that was from Amy? It's
01:03PM 20 kind of like a correspondence that I skipped over earlier, but I'm
21 going to read this into the record.

22
23 "Good afternoon, Members of the Parks and Recreation Committee.
24 After appearing before a judge with an assistant district attorney,
25 we have to come to a temporary agreement with the defendants...are
26 moving forward. We will appear again in mid-September to continue
27 to try to resolve the issue of the removal and disposal of the
28 yellow material.

29
01:04PM 30 "We've updated our excavation plan to reflect that the removal and
31 disposal of material will occur in a tiered approach, with the
32 disposal of the red must be dispose of off Long Island, and the
33 blue material asbestos requires special handling happening first,
34 and the yellow material can be disposed of on Long Island happening
35 last.

36
37 "This is due to the fact that we were in disagreement with the
38 defendants about whether the yellow material can be disposed of
39 anywhere other than a landfill and, as stated above, are scheduled
01:04PM 40 to appear in court again to continue to work to come to an
41 agreement. New York State DEC supports our position.

42
43 "The defendants are preparing the final deliverable documents that
44 the county must have before removal and disposal can begin. These
45 documents include, for instance, the registration and model-make
46 information on the trucks, which will be used to cart material and
47 letters from the off-Long Island landfills, which have agreed to
48 accept the red and blue materials.

49
01:04PM 50 "Please also note the Court indicated that it would make sure the
51 defendants would clean up the total amount of contamination or face
52 incarceration. The judge indicated he would reopen the plea if
53 there was not total cleanup. We estimate we will have those
54 documents in hand in approximately three weeks, and the initial
55 cleanup will begin in a week or so after that or four weeks from
56 today. I will share further updates as I have them."

1
2 So thank you for that. I know it's really been problematic for the
3 neighboring community that these defendants have been dragging
4 their feet, have been, you know, making legal maneuvers to try to
5 avoid getting this done and getting this done quickly, and that's
6 very frustrating to Parks Department, to legislators, and to the
7 community. I know, Sue, it might not be your district, but it's
8 very close, right?
9

01:05PM 10 **LEG. BERLAND:**

11 Yeah, it's actually Legislator Donnelly, but it's within the Town
12 of Huntington, and I still get lots of calls from people there.
13 They are waiting, people who have used the equestrian park that
14 can't be used anymore, and, you know, people want it taken care of.
15 So it's good that it's moving along, and I hope that the judge
16 holds the defendants' feet to the fire because that's what's going
17 to happen in order for it to get cleaned up.
18

01:06PM 19 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

20 What about the RFP that was going out on the equestrian facility?
21

22 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

23 Yeah. We're all set. I was waiting until the work started so I
24 could run them both parallel because it will take a couple months
25 to get through it, but if the cleanup takes a little longer, we'll
26 just hold off on the signing of the final documents until the place
27 is ready to get in there. We don't know what the extent is going
28 to be to the infrastructure while they're doing the work. That,
29 we'll have to see what's going to be dug up. There is underground
01:06PM 30 wiring. There's electric fences. There's little out buildings
31 that were put on there that have electric running to them, so I
32 think there's going to be a lot of extra work that may have to be
33 done before we are able to get the successful bidder in. That's
34 what I'm anticipating.
35

36 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

37 So just remind me: On the RFP, where are we with that for the
38 equestrian? You're holding off, like you haven't lead it?
39

01:07PM 40 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

41 I haven't lead it yet, yes.
42

43 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

44 Now that the judge has ordered this work to begin, can you let it
45 so that that process is happening simultaneously?
46

47 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

48 Right, so as soon as the work starts because it's going to take
49 minimum three to six months for the cleanup. That's what they're
01:07PM 50 projecting, and I would think the same with the RFP, about three
51 months for the RFP.
52

53 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

54 Right. But it should be momentarily they start cleaning up, right?
55

56 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

1 Yes.

2

3 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

4 It's the judge's order, so yeah, okay. We just -- we don't want
5 there to be more delays that are unnecessary after the cleanup is
6 completed for there to actually be usage, that equestrian use that
7 is so desperately --

8

9 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

01:08PM 10 I think there will be a lot of interest in the property also.

11

12 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

13 Any other questions on West Hills? Anything else for the
14 commissioner? Thank you. Oh, and congratulations to -- two things
15 we should know about. Congratulations to the lifeguards winning
16 second place, Smith Point lifeguards. We were there earlier this
17 week. We also started recycling plastic bottles at Smith Point. A
18 new pilot project that is a shared services project with the Town
19 of Brookhaven.

20

21 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

22 Right.

23

24 **CHAIRWOMAN HAHN:**

25 So I'm really excited. It's about time that that happens at our
26 oceanfront beach, and our work on trying to eliminate our trash and
27 litter on our beaches and in our parks, so making sure those
28 plastic bottles actually get recycled instead of just thrown away
29 will divert them from the waste stream and from the landfill and
30 hopefully they'll get used. Thank you.

32 We're going to move along. No presentations. No appointments.
33 We're going to go to tabled resolutions.

34

35 1323, Bond Resolution of the County of Suffolk, New York,
36 authorizing the issuance of \$1,500,000 Bonds to finance the cost of

2 "Fuchs Pond."

9 see whether there would be any response to this or not because I
