3 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

4 All right. Welcome, everyone, to the Legislature's Parks and  
5 Recreation Committee. If we could all rise for a salute to the  
6 flag led by Legislator Berland.

01:41PM 10 Okay, Legislator McCaffrey has an excused absence.

11  
12 Public portion. Do we have any cards?

13  
14 **MS. ELLIS:**

15 No, Ma'am.

16  
17 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

18 Is there anyone in the audience who would like to speak? Seeing  
19 none, we will close the public portion.

20  
21 **APPOINTMENTS RESOLUTIONS**

22  
23 Appointments: We have Introductory Resolution 2114, Reappointing  
24 Richard (F.) White, Jr., as a member of the Suffolk County Board of  
25 Trustees (of) Parks, Recreation and Conservation. (Fleming). I'll  
26 make a motion.

28 **LEG. LINDSAY:**

29 Second.

31 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

32 Seconded by Legislator Lindsay. Just bear with me one second.  
33 Okay, we have a motion and a second. All those in favor? Opposed?  
34 Abstentions? It is approved. (VOTE: 5-0-0-1. PO GREGORY  
35 INCLUDED IN VOTE. ABSENT: LEG. McCAFFREY)

37 Introductory Resolution 2118, Reappointing member of the Suffolk  
38 County Board of Trustees of Parks, Recreation, and Conservation  
39 (Gilbert (A.) Cardillo). (Krupski). Motion by -- Legislator  
01:42PM 40 Krupski, you're not on the Committee, right. So I'll make the  
41 motion; seconded by Legislator Berland.

43 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

44 On the motion, if I may?

45  
46 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

47 On the motion.

48  
49 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

01:42PM 50 I just think that -- you know, Gil has served as Parks Trustee as  
51 Riverhead's representative for a number of years with distinction.  
52 And I'd like you to support his reappointment.

53  
54 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

55 Thank you. All those in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? It is  
56 approved. (VOTE: 5-0-0-1. PO GREGORY INCLUDED IN VOTE. ABSENT:

4 **TABLED RESOLUTIONS**

5 We have no presentations on the agenda today. We will move onto  
6 Tabled Resolutions. **Introductory Resolution 1997, Appropriating**  
7 **funds in connection with Millers Pond Weir CP 7206. (Kennedy).**  
8 I'm going to make a motion to table. Legislator Trotta?  
9

10 **LEG. TROTTA:**

11 I'd like to make a motion to approve.  
12

13 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

14 Motion to approve by Legislator Trotta. We have the Commissioner  
15 here, Phil Berdolt. Commissioner Berdolt. We need a second on one  
16 of them. We have a second to the motion to table by Legislator  
17 Lindsay.  
18

19 Commissioner? Good afternoon. How are you?  
20

21 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

22 Very well, thank you. We have been looking at this. Public Works  
23 did go back to the original consultant who looked at this entire  
24 area and did determine that there was a possibility that by  
25 lowering the lake a few inches may help with the surrounding homes  
26 on possible flooding.  
27

28 So with that being said, that, yes, there's a possibility that by  
29 putting in an automatic weir, it could help further down the line.  
01:44PM 30 There are -- as some have suggested, there are these cookie cutter,  
31 already-designed weirs that could be put in place. So we're still  
32 looking at the fact whether we need anything from Planning or not.  
33 And at this point we don't know if we do.  
34

35 So, Legislator Kennedy, we'd like to keep this tabled so Public  
36 Works can look at it and -- for this next week, find out what is  
37 available, what they have and what's determined so maybe we can  
38 just move the funds for purchasing instead of actually operating or  
39 planning.

42 Legislator Kennedy.  
43

44 **LEG. KENNEDY:**

45 Can we do that, Phil? This is a capital project; waited three  
46 years. It's the end of the year. Does it not expire?  
47

48 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

49 Well, we have one more in December, I believe, correct?

51 **MR. NOLAN:**

52 One more cycle.  
53

54 **LEG. KENNEDY:**

55 One more. One more.  
56

1 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

2 One more.

3  
4 **LEG. KENNEDY:**

5 And will it be done by then?

6  
7 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

8 They're looking at it right now. So, I mean, it only took them  
9 after our last -- went back to the consultant, went through, you  
10 know, hundreds of pages of the report and got their opinion on it.  
11 So, I think, yes, it can be done. We can look into this and try  
12 and expedite it as quick as possible for you.

13  
14 **LEG. KENNEDY:**

15 Thank you. I just want to let you know that on the Friday after  
16 Thanksgiving, I called the DEC because the water in the pond was  
17 three feet from the road. And they gave us a temporary okay for  
18 that day to lift the board but I drove back and checked and I  
19 didn't want to go further.

20  
21 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

22 You didn't want to get out and lift it yourself? (Laughter)

23  
24 **LEG. KENNEDY:**

25 No, I can't. It takes two men. That's the reason why we want  
26 automatic.

27  
28 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

29 Right, but it should also be locked.

30  
31 **LEG. KENNEDY:**

32 But they cracked it the last time.

33  
34 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

35 Yeah.

36  
37 **LEG. KENNEDY:**

38 And they've cracked it a hundred times; and, hence, the reason for  
39 having an automatic system; that people cannot lift themselves.  
40 All right. Hopefully you'll have the answer by next session.  
41 Thank you.

42  
43 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

44 Sure.

45  
46 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

47 We have a motion to table and a second. All those in favor?  
48 Opposed? Abstentions? **1997 is tabled. (VOTE: 5-0-0-1. PO**  
49 **GREGORY INCLUDED IN VOTE. ABSENT: LEG. McCAFFREY)**

50  
51 **INTRODUCTORY RESOLUTIONS**

52  
53 **Introductory Resolution 2031, Authorizing use of (the) Indian**  
54 **Island County Park by Jayasports for its Indian Island Trail 5K and**  
55 **15K Run Fundraiser. (Co. Exec.). I'll make a motion to approve;**  
56 **seconded by Legislator Berland. All those in favor? Opposed?**

1 Abstentions? 2031 is approved. (VOTE: 5-0-0-1. PO GREGORY  
2 INCLUDED IN VOTE. ABSENT: LEG. McCAFFREY)

3  
4 Introductory Resolution 2054, Amending the 2018 Capital Budget and  
5 Program and accepting and appropriating grant funds and  
6 appropriating County funds in connection with Reconstruction of the  
7 West Sayville County Park Roadway and Entrance (CP 7208).  
8 (Lindsay). Motion by Legislator Lindsay; seconded by myself. All  
9 those in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? 2054 is approved. (VOTE:  
10 5-0-0-1. PO GREGORY INCLUDED IN VOTE. ABSENT: LEG. McCAFFREY)

11  
12 Introductory Resolution 2096, Accepting the donation of certain  
13 lands now owned by Dowling College and transferring such lands to  
14 the Suffolk County Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation  
15 for Open Space Preservation purposes (SCTM No.  
16 0200-988.30-02.00-001.000). (Co. Exec.). I'm going to make a  
17 motion to discharge without recommendation. And I will look to  
18 Legislator Lindsay to second. There's been -- Commissioner, if you  
19 don't mind, there's been some back and forth. And I think that's  
01:47PM 20 part of why Legislator Krupski is here today. There's been some  
21 back and forth about the possible use of this for dredge spoils; a  
22 possible use as a site for piping clovers; all kinds of interests  
23 and maybe you can comment.

24  
25 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

26 Sure. Well, this is a free donation from Dowling College. And the  
27 the island itself is called New Made Island. Right now there is  
28 habitat on it. And there are protected species of bird: Least  
29 terns, I think, killdeer. Parks doesn't object to this at all  
01:48PM 30 because there's a good possibility moving forward that if we have  
31 any issues at Smith Point with the plover, because you know right  
32 now they're de-vegetating. Fish and Wildlife is in there.  
33 Unfortunately they are de-vegetating the area for habitat -- for  
34 plover habitat. This could be an area that we could somehow maybe  
35 use as leverage later on in case there is a take, which a take  
36 could be anything from disturbance of a nest to an egg being  
37 crushed or a bird being killed.

38  
39 And if that does happen at Smith Point Park, Fish and Wildlife will  
01:48PM 40 look for more land. This could be our trade off. That island  
41 could be de-vegetated and made strictly for habitat. So we are  
42 definitely in favor of this. I know there is a time constraint  
43 here that Dowling College needs to get this down before the end of  
44 the year because of the -- I guess they're liquidating their  
45 assets.

46  
47 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

48 Tax implications, I'm sure.

49  
50 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

51 Yeah.

52  
53 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

54 Okay. So as I said, we have Legislators who'd like to ask some  
55 questions. Legislator Krupski was on the list first; and then  
56 Legislator Lindsay to follow.

1 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

2 Thank you. So, you know, Commissioner, I am familiar with what  
3 you're saying with the Fish and Wildlife actually de-vegetating  
4 areas for the bird habitat to create certain bird habitat that they  
5 find favorable.

6  
7 On the NRCS parcels that Planning and Economic Development made an  
8 offer on a couple of years ago, there was one that we didn't do  
9 outreach through my office to the DEC that -- there was one that  
01:49PM 10 they would favorable as a dredge spoil site in the future. So we  
11 just wanted to put a belt and suspenders on this with DEC.

12  
13 We reached out to Kerri Meek-Gallagher and we said, you know, is  
14 this favorable as a dredge spoil site; just to make sure that if  
15 they would designate it as such a site, which from what you said  
16 with Fish and Wildlife instead of de-vegetating it, obviously you'd  
17 want to put sand on it, pump sand on it and elevate it. That is a  
18 possibility.

19  
01:50PM 20 So we just wanted to make sure that we looked at it from all  
21 angles, from all advantages. And obviously we want to have it in  
22 our inventory, but we want to have it for what would be  
23 appropriate. So, thank you, Madam Chair.

24  
25 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

26 Yeah. And, like I said, just north -- just south of that we have  
27 used our own property for dredge spoils in that exact location. So  
28 it is a possibility. And I would think that at some point as long  
29 as it's done, any kind of dredge or anything done to the island is  
01:50PM 30 outside of the plover nesting timeframe; they would definitely, I  
31 would think, be in favor of something like that.

32  
33 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

34 Thank you.

35  
36 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

37 Director Lansdale would like to make comments.

38  
39 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

01:50PM 40 Legislator Lindsay, do you mind if we go to Director Lansdale and  
41 Laretta Fischer?

42  
43 **LEG. LINDSAY:**

44 Sure.

45  
46 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

47 Thank you.

48  
49 **DIRECTOR LANSDALE:**

01:50PM 50 Just in response to that inquiry, we shared the information that I  
51 had e-mailed out before this Committee that there are endangered  
52 species on this property. And I shared the information with Peter  
53 Scully, who was the former Regional Director for DEC. And his  
54 impression based on the information I provided him was that -- the  
55 question was whether DEC would issue a permit for dredge spoils to  
56 be placed on that site. And he said based on the information that

1 I had shared with him, it would be highly unlikely that the DEC  
2 would issue such a permit.

3  
4 **LEG. KRUPSKI:**

5 Thank you. That's why we've reached out to the DEC directly.  
6 Thank you.

7  
8 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**  
9 Legislator Lindsay.

11 **LEG. LINDSAY:**

12 Good afternoon. My question is, is there any structures on the  
13 island that would have to be maintained?

14  
15 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**  
16 There's nothing at all.

17  
18 **LEG. LINDSAY:**  
19 No historic airplane sea hangars or boat houses or -- (Laughter)

20  
21 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**  
22 No weirs, nothing.

23  
24 **LEG. LINDSAY:**  
25 Great. Thank you.

26  
27 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**  
28 You're welcome.

29  
30 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**  
31 Okay. So we have a motion to discharge without recommendation,  
32 which will get it to the floor but, you know, kind of highlight it  
33 for everybody that we are waiting for more information. And then  
34 we had another Legislator who had a question? Sorry. And so we  
35 have a motion to discharge without recommendation. We have a  
36 second. And then all those in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? It  
37 is discharged without recommendation. (VOTE: 5-0-0-1. PO GREGORY  
38 INCLUDED IN VOTE. ABSENT: LEG. McCAFFREY)
