2 (The meeting was called to order at 10:39 a.m.)
3

4 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

5 Welcome to the Seniors and Human Services committee. Please rise
6 for the Pledge led by Legislator Hahn.
7

8 (Pledge of Allegiance)
9

10 Please remain standing for a moment of silent meditation and prayer
11 as we think of those fighting for our nation and the loved ones we
12 have lost.

14 (Moment of Silence Observed)
15

16 Thank you. I do not have correspondence; however, we do have a few
17 cards for public comment. Glen Svoboda, will you come to the
18 podium, please.
19

20 **MR. SVOBODA:**

21 Good morning, Ms. Anker, the rest of the legislature. My name's
22 Glen Svoboda. I work with Leon Cozell (ph). I'm with the
23 Parenting Rights Institute up in Albany. We're the people that did
24 the parenting march in D.C. in March, three miles of some of the
25 most hardest permits to get. We all marched. We're all sick of
26 this family court abuse and the CPS abuse. We've been paying
27 attention around the country on what Suffolk County is doing
28 because this is the latest study. It's been handed out to
29 congress. Pallets of all the suicides, the crooked attorneys. We
30 work with the New York State Civil Liberties on all of the money
31 where it's going. Suffolk has to be one of the worst in the
32 country on the abuse. Mrs. Anker, we're waiting for you to call us
33 back. This is not a negotiable anymore.
34

35 We just went went to court, Central Islip Family Court, the second
36 floor family court. We videotaped the CPS forcing without any
37 warrants to steal kids from the daycare. The judge was absolutely
38 sliding in his seat. We filled up the whole courtroom, but they
39 took us out of there because now it's a child. We want cameras in
40 your courts. We want CPS with cameras, just like the Suffolk
41 County Police Department. We're tired of the special privileges
42 that go to one for the people that are running the garbage cartel.
43 Sheriffs, where their wives get crucified. Same with the people
44 that go inside court offices. These inside people always get
45 special treatment while the rest of us get crucified. So we need
46 you to step up to the plate.
47

48 I'll give you a list on where the money is going to in Suffolk
49 County. I'll tell you all the dirty techniques that Suffolk is
50 doing. I'm on YouTube all over the place. I'm doing dog this
51 30-plus years, so we need you to start coming to the place. We
52 don't want the CPS -- we don't want the family court to start
53 self-policing themselves. I used to work with Gail Prudente (ph),
54 Bob O'Mara (ph), Allen Bennis (ph), Bob Margolin (ph). I was the
55 fellow that they asked. You are crucifying people too. You know
56 that, Mrs. Anker. \$80,000 in six years child support, I have to

1 pay, and on disability in six years because they want to collect
2 their Title 4D. So I have to go back before Judge Joseph, who is
3 the sixth worst judge in New York State. Judge Leo is the fifth
4 worst judge in New York State. The list goes on and on. We
5 document everything you people are doing. And by the way, you are
6 blocking our -- somebody's blocking our site now on the Parenting
7 Rights because we are doing one in June, and I have information.
8 All last night, we got people calling that you've met filling up
9 these rooms. I'm not sure who this person is, but we got to
10 understand that there's a court forensic evaluator on Long Island
11 by the name of Peter Favaro, F-A-V-A-R-O, and he's hired to take
12 down sites.

13
14 So we're waiting for you to answer us back, Mrs. Anker, please. We
15 don't want to wait four weeks, but something better be done. We'd
16 like to sit in on with what's going on with these people because
17 there's too many people getting rich off of stealing people's
18 children.

19
20 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

21 All right, Glenn. We appreciate you coming here. I know you have
22 been in touch with our office before this tragic situation started,
23 but we appreciate your advocacy and look forward to working with
24 you.

25
26 **MR. SVOBODA:**

27 Just so you know, Newsday sales were slumping, and they needed to
28 boost. Every 10, 15 years, they put out something about the courts,
29 so they got what they want, and now they're squelching us again, so
30 we already know their techniques. So thank you very much.

31
32 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

33 Glenn, thank you. Our next speaker is Anthony Cibelli.

34
35 **MR. SVOBODA:**

36 He's coming from the Bronx. They said they'll give him special
37 treatment around 11:00.

38
39 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

40 Okay.

41
42 **MR. SVOBODA:**

43 We'll see what you can do. Thank you.

44
45 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

46 I'll pass him up for now. We have a couple more speakers.
47 Christopher Loeb, please come to the podium.

48
49 **MR. LOEB:**

50 I'm sorry. I have a little update about what's going on right now.

51
52 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

53 You have three minutes. You have three minutes to speak.

54
55 **MS. TOOKER:**

56 You know what? Can I go first instead of him?

1
2 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

3 You have three minutes to speak.
4

5 **MS. TOOKER:**

6 Yep. We know how we have to beat the clock. Good morning,
7 everyone. How are you? I am Marie Tooker. I spoke at your first
8 committee hearing, so congratulations on starting one. When it
9 comes to our children, as we know, they are in grave danger in
10 Suffolk County, and the fact that you guys made a committee brings
11 -- to let us know that you are aware of these issues.
12

13 One thing, though, that I did ask for and begged for is that you
14 guys help Justyna that with full custody of her other two children
15 and to keep her out of this grave horror show of family court, but
16 the opposite happened. CPS, Judge Tantone used her vulnerability,
17 her fears to now take supervised rights over her two sons.
18 Actually, it was a circus. His first order was all completely
19 wrong. His second order was completely wrong. It had to be
20 rewritten twice. If you ever see that original order, there's so
21 much handwriting on it, it can't even be read properly, so we're
22 right off out of the gate, we're here saying, Look, people, Suffolk
23 County residents, we're here to now pay attention to your children,
24 we're aware that we have problems, but right out of the gate the
25 most two vulnerable children right now are Justyna's two sons. The
26 pain and suffering that they have experienced, none of us could
27 ever imagine.
28

29 So why, why -- when I asked you guys to help her, help her. She
30 went there with no lawyer. You guys, the hallway is a horror show.
31 They had people stationed sitting next to her that were the county
32 attorneys quietly sitting next to her acting like they knew her,
33 but what they were doing was listening to every move she made; then
34 they got up, they walked over and told CPS everything. They had
35 other attorneys in the hallway standing close next to her
36 eavesdropping, listening to everything she had to say. Then we
37 found him going back to the new law guardian telling him
38 everything. I mean, it's all there. All you guys have to do is go
39 get the cameras in the hallway of family court, and you will see
40 all these moves happening. That is the most scariest thing I've
41 ever experienced. I'm begging you now. Pay attention to what's
42 happening to Justyna Valva.
43

44 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

45 Thank you, Marie. Thank you for speaking today. Christopher, are
46 you available to speak?
47

48 **MR. LOEB:**

49 Yes, I'm available. I'm not here to speak on Justyna Valva. I'm
50 sorry about what happened to her. It's a tragedy. But I'm a
51 victim of family court corruption. I'm going to speak to you like
52 you're unaware of what's going on in family court, but so the law
53 guardians as well as the judges and the majority of the lawyers
54 that defend the parents that try to fight for their children back
55 work together, and it's a systematic problem. Kids are being
56 stolen from their primary caregiver and given to the abuser because

1 we all know that the parent that's the protector of the child is
2 going to pay more money, is going to fight for that child, spend
3 every dollar that they have to get that child back, and they go
4 through hell and their lives are tortured, and they're miserable,
5 and imagine your kids being ripped from you, and you can't do
6 nothing to get it back, and you pay every last penny, and you lose
7 your house, and you lose your friends. You start to develop mental
8 conditions because your children are torn from you, and the defense
9 attorneys are just more money, give us more money, we'll do this,
10 we'll do that.

11
12 I sat in the court houses and I watched what goes on, and some
13 mothers and fathers aren't even allowed in the courtroom because
14 they're being told they're not allowed in the courtroom that's a
15 lie. That's a constitutional right to be allowed in that
16 courtroom, and I went through this and, unfortunately, everyone
17 knows my situation. I'm sure some of you do. I have a prior
18 because I was unable to fight for my someone that I love -- for her
19 daughter's being ripped apart. I had a stigmatic label on my end,
20 but it doesn't matter.

21
22 This is -- the evil that's prevailing inside in family court is --
23 something needs to happen, and an outside agency -- if we're not
24 doing anything about about it, and that seems to be the issue,
25 needs to come in and revamp the court system. I'm not even talking
26 about family court. I'm talking about the whole court system
27 altogether, but specifically family court, because children are
28 being stolen from their families, and lives are being ruined and
29 we're supposed to be protecting our children. We're supposed to be
30 saving our children. We're supposed to be protecting our youth.
31 This is our people. These are who we are.

32
33 We are supposed to be strengthening our country. Look at it as a
34 global aspect. How are we going to be able to fight a war? I'm not
35 saying -- I'm bouncing all over the place -- but if we are killing
36 our people? What's going on? We need to wake up. Wake up. If
37 you're saying you're going to inspect and do something, start right
38 now. Don't wait for a vote. Go in right now. This woman is
39 suffering. She's going through it right now. She doesn't know who
40 to trust, and she's being pulled by now the county executive -- I'm
41 going to say it -- by the county executive Steve Bellone is pulling
42 -- what's her name? Justyna. I'm sorry. Justyna -- to look good,
43 to make her feel -- She doesn't know who to trust. She can't trust
44 Steve Bellone. She can't trust people from the county. She can't
45 trust anyone. Who is she going to trust? Who is she going to go
46 to? And I'm telling you right now, Steve Bellone is corrupt, so
47 who else is corrupt.

48
49 **MR. SVOBODA:**
50 We don't trust him.

51
52 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**
53 Thank you.

54
55 **MS. TOOKER:**
56 The bell has rung.

1
2 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

3 It just rang. Thank you for speaking again. This is why you guys
4 are allowed -- there's freedom of speech. There's a way for you to
5 let us know your thoughts. I want you to understand that all the
6 legislators here, we care. I've been through family court, and it
7 was not a good experience. Unfortunately, the county cannot change
8 the jurisdiction related to the court system; that's New York
9 State. So as you continue with your advocacy, which I encourage
10 you to continue your activism, your advocacy, you know, address the
11 the jurisdictions, address the different levels of government, and
12 speak with passion. But I also encourage you to speak with respect
13 because we all deserve respect, and again we respect that you're
14 here speaking, and I want to commend Legislator Hahn for moving
15 forward with the external CPS meetings and investigations. New
16 York State is also investigating, the D.A.'s office is also looking
17 into this, and this committee also, we are following this very
18 close; so again, we really appreciate your time.

19
20 Is there anybody else in the audience who would like to speak? I
21 see no further business. This meeting is adjourned. I'm sorry. I
22 just want to make sure. Mr. Cibelli, is he here?

23
24 **MR. SVOBODA:**

25 I know he's on his way. I apologize. He's gone to every one of
26 these hearings.

27
28 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

29 Can you remind him to submit something in writing? I'd be more
30 than happy to take that. Thank you, Glenn.

31
32 **MS. TOOKER:**

33 I think somebody else is here to speak. She just walked in.

34
35 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**

36 We have sort of officially adjourned this meeting, but she can also
37 submit something in writing if she would like to comment.

38
39 **MR. SVOBODA:**

40 Thank you very much.

42 **CHAIRWOMAN ANKER:**
