10 the grant funding. If you feel it's necessary, I suppose we could
11 amend the resolution. But if it was going to be replaced, we would
12 replace it probably with forfeiture funds, but the life of the
13 vehicle is going to be many years.

16 Right. I just remembered -- Lance, I don't know if -- you know,
17 it's been -- I've been with the Legislature for, I don't know,
18 almost 18 years now, maybe, and we've always been very careful to
19 make sure some of these resolutions say *temporary increase in*
20 *fleet*, because for some reason we've always been told that if it
21 doesn't then we're somehow required to replace the vehicles at some
22 point unless we go through -- I don't know if anybody -- if either
23 Sarah or Lance can explain that. And so is this a policy decision
24 we're making on this particular vehicle that says we have to always
25 replace it?

26

27 **DIRECTOR REINHEIMER:**

28 Yeah, that I'm not sure of. I'm not sure if it's in code, if it's
29 codified or if it's just a policy decision on trying to hold the
30 line on fleet. I think you have -- you know, vehicles have to be
31 decommissioned prior to replacement and I think it's a policy
32 decision on how many vehicles you purchase or replace. But on a
33 legal aspect of it, your question, I can't answer that.

36 Legislator Hahn?

38 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

39 Yes.

42 If I could just mention that, you know, at whatever time this
43 vehicle did reach its maximum life and was taken out of service and
44 we did want to purchase something else. We would have to go
45 through the standard County purchasing process, so we wouldn't be
46 able to purchase something unless it went through the approvals of
47 the County anyway.

49 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

50 No, I get that. I just -- (*laughter*). Sometimes there is *We*
51 *always do it this way and we always ask about, you know, X, Y and Z*
52 *because* -- and there are rules that people tell you about and then
53 all of a sudden they're gone (*laughter*). So were there never rules
54 before is I guess what I want to understand here. You know --

1 **MS. SIMPSON:**

2 I mean, we have always had it where if it is a -- that if a vehicle
3 was being added temporarily that it expressly was a temporary
4 increase in the fleet. Because once you permanently increase the
5 fleet there is the expectation that you will replace this vehicle
6 going forward in the future. That's why, generally speaking, these
7 resolutions include language about it being a temporary increase,
8 so that we're not bound to replace the vehicle when its useful life
9 arrives.

12 Right, and that's my point. But -- you know, so I don't know if --
13 I guess we're past the amending point.

20 certainly something that, especially now, we don't want to be

28 it's -- you know, the UASI grant funding is a three-year rolling
29 funding and it's from 2017. We were able to reprogram this money
30 to make this purchase and we're coming up against the end of the --

33 Maybe we could get a CN. I would imagine we would have 12 votes if
34 we changed it to include the temporary increase in fleet.

37 That's obviously up to you, Legislator Hahn. You know, let me

41 Stephanie, could you look into that? And then maybe I'll put

2 I mean, this resolution clearly has a typo in it. That word *any*
3 could very well have supposed to have been *temporary*; it's a typo.
4 *Any* doesn't make any sense in that sentence. Why isn't that just a
5 scrivener's error, we replace the word *any* with *temporary* and we
6 move on.

11 Counsel, can we make this -- treat this as a scrivener's error?
12

13 **MS. SIMPSON:**

14 I don't know that you -- usually the temporary increase is also
15 reflected in the WHEREAS clauses, not just the title, and there's
16 no reference in the actual body of the resolution about it being a
17 temporary increase.
18

19 **P.O. CALARCO:**

20 Okay.
21

22 **MS. SIMPSON:**

23 That's my only concern.
24

25 **P.O. CALARCO:**

26 So we can't do that. All right, let's -- I've got a list here of
27 Legislators that want to speak now; Legislator Kennedy.
28

29 **LEG. KENNEDY:**

09:42AM 30 Nope, scrivener's error was my question. Thank you.
31

32 **P.O. CALARCO:**

33 All right, that's great, great minds. Legislator Berland.
34

35 **LEG. BERLAND:**

36 Well, my question was for Sarah, actually. If you increase the
37 fleet by a grant, does that differentiate it from other vehicles
38 that we've purchased? Because if this is a grant -- if this is
39 from grant money and it expires at the end of the year, why does,
09:42AM 40 you know, a vehicle that we got through a grant obligate us to
41 replace it if we didn't buy it in the first place?
42

43 **MS. SIMPSON:**

44 I'm trying to -- let me think about that for a minute. I know it's
45 something that has been asked before where we've used grant money,
46 and I believe George, if I'm recalling correctly, had opined that
47 even if we're using grant money, it can obligate us in the future
48 if we don't have it as a temporary increase in the fleet.
49

51 Okay.
52

53 **P.O. CALARCO:**

54 I think the issue -- and I recall this, Legislator Hahn, from many
55 moons ago, and I think the issue becomes not necessarily there's an
56 obligation, but more that there is the opportunity. And so once we

1 increase the number of vehicles allowed to be in the fleet by this
2 one, when this vehicle gets decommissioned theoretically the
3 department can go and purchase another vehicle even if -- and use
4 County funds to do that. Obviously they would need to have a
5 funding source from the Legislature that's been approved to do it,
6 but nonetheless they would have that authority and they can
7 certainly come back and make the case that it's a needed vehicle,
8 as per trying to make the case that they need to add a permanent
9 increase to the fleet. And this is something that goes back a
09:44AM 10 long -- many years back to when Legislator Hahn and I both were
11 Aides.
12

13 **LEG. BERLAND:**

14 Well, I mean, I would think if we got -- you know, if we're getting
15 this as a grant and we're not paying for it, you know, if we can't
16 make it happen and the time runs out, it seems to me kind of silly
17 not to take the vehicle. So I would think we should work out
18 something. Maybe we -- you know, when we're having discussions on
19 the record, it's not part of the resolution but we put discussions
09:44AM 20 on the record that it's with the understanding that it's, you know,
21 we're getting this through a grant and, you know, that it doesn't
22 necessarily carry with it the opportunity to replace it with County
23 money.
24

26 Sure. That's -- I hear you. Okay. Legislator Fleming?

45 And again, although it increases our fleet and we could conceivably
46 buy something, I would agree with Presiding Officer Calarco that it
47 doesn't mandate that it has to be replaced. We'd still have to go
48 through the standard County funding and purchasing approval
49 process, so if the wherewithal wasn't there to replace it when it
09:45AM 50 eventually reached end of life, we wouldn't be able to replace it.

41 Suffolk Police concentrates on the west end and we partner with
42 other entities. It's educational and enforcement operation.

43
44 **LEG. FLEMING:**

45 And just to refresh my memory, it's enforcement of your -- it's
46 season contraband or licensing?

47
48 **CHIEF SHARKEY:**

49 No, what we have is foreign flag vessels, you know, enter the
09:53AM 50 waterways of Long Island which is an access point then up into the
51 metropolitan area. We check them to make sure -- they're supposed
52 to register when they come into our waters and many of them don't
53 know what the requirements are or what they're supposed to have on
54 their vessels. And we do come across, you know, violations, we
55 come across, you know, sometimes weapons on the boats and things
56 like that. So it's a combination of an educational program and an

1 enforcement program to interact with these vessels that are
2 entering our waterways from foreign areas.

3
4 **LEG. FLEMING:**

5 But the enforcement is with regard to the carrying of contraband.

6
7 **CHIEF SHARKEY:**

8 Yes.

9
10 **LEG. FLEMING:**

11 Okay.

12
13 **CHIEF SHARKEY:**

14 And that they're abiding by, you know, the rules of the waterway
15 and they have the proper equipment on their boats, etcetera,
16 etcetera.

32 just sort of get a breakdown of the equipment. And I know that
33 these defibrillator batteries and a lot of these things have to be
34 replaced and maintained, and I'm just wondering if we could just
35 get a little bit more detail of the specific equipment and how long
36 will this last us.

37
38 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

39 Yes, Legislator. I'm going to introduce Deputy Inspector John
40 Blosser, he's the Commanding Officer of our MedCAT team and he'll
41 be able to answer some of the more technical questions on it.

42
43 **LEG. SPENCER:**

44 Thank you.

45
46 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

47 Good morning.

48
49 **LEG. SPENCER:**

50 Good morning, sir. How are you?

51
52 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

53 Fine, thank you. So this Capital Project request has three
54 different aspects to it. The largest is the automated external
55 defibrillator replacement. Our AED units, some of them date back
56 to 1996. They're Lifepak 500s which has been an excellent unit,

1 had a great service life, at this point is way past its effective
2 service life to the point where there hasn't been support from the
3 manufacturer for a number of years.

4
5 There are reliabilities with it now, we just got some guidance from
6 the manufacturer about a specific malfunction and they basically --
7 they're just advisory. There's not a recall, they won't fix it,
8 they're just letting us know that there's a problem with the unit.
9 It's basically due to wear, it's the connector where the pads plug
10 into the unit can wear out in the unit at times and make the thing
11 fail. So basically if that happens during a call or a deployment
12 they tell you unplug it once, plug it back in to try to make
13 contact, if it doesn't make contact the second time then go to a
14 different unit. So these things are -- they're excellent units,
15 they've served us well, but they're well past their useful life.
16 So that's the majority of their request.

17
18 The second part is the current Lifepak 15 Conventional Modern
19 Defibrillator units. The units we have are Lifepak 12s; again,
20 well past their service life. That request is not nearly as large,
21 it's only one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, they basically
22 replace existing units in our units that are deployed as advanced
23 life support first response units.

24
25 And then the last request is for Lucas Automated CPR devices.
26 Again, we have Marine Bureau deployed some older automated CPR
27 devices, the -- they're auto pulses made by Zoll, they're first
28 generation auto pulses; again, well past their service life. So
29 we're not looking to really add any expansion here as much as just
30 replacing stuff that while all of it has served us well is all out
31 of manufacture or all out of its service life.

32
33 **LEG. SPENCER:**

34 How many units of each thing does this resolution cover?

35
36 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

37 So the resolution goes for four years now, we initially requested
38 three. So the AEDs, that's 300, that's 410 AEDs over the course of
39 the first three years. The Lifepak 15s, it's a total of seven,
40 which is one for the first year, one for the second year, two for
41 the third year, three for the fourth year. The Lucas automated CPR
42 device a total of five; none for the first year, one for the second
43 year, one for the third year, three for the fourth year. So we
44 actually -- we front-loaded the AEDs because we feel that's the
45 most critical need that we'll have the most likelihood of actually
46 getting deployed the most often and we back-loaded the Lifepak 15s
47 and Lucas device to the end of the cycle.

48
49 **LEG. SPENCER:**

50 Well, not only do I support this, I would like to just state
51 personally, and I probably reflect the sentiment of a lot of my
52 colleagues, that for this type of equipment, please don't let it go
53 well beyond its useful life. This stuff, as you can imagine, that
54 being in a situation as -- I don't have to tell you that you need
55 this equipment and you have to unplug it and plug it back in to
56 maybe get it to work. You know, whatever I think that this body as

1 a policy position would probably just make sure that all that
2 equipment needs to be up-to-date at all times, for what it's worth.
3 But thank you, sir. I appreciate the explanation.

4
5 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

6 Thank you.

7
8 **LEG. SPENCER:**

9 And you obviously would have my full support.

11 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

12 Terrific.

13
14 **P.O. CALARCO:**

15 Thank you, Legislator Spencer. You opened up the floodgates,
16 I have a long list now. Legislator Sunderman.

19 I am so sorry (*laughter*).

22 Question on the Lifepak 12s and the Lifepak 500s. So that they're
23 no longer being supported, as you know, by Lifepak, the 12s,
24 there's no more parts available, right; would we agree to that?

27 As far as I know.

28
29 **LEG. SUNDERMAN:**

30 Yeah. No, I know they are; as a first responder, I know that
31 they're not supported. So why wouldn't we front-load more of this
32 to get more equipment earlier instead of waiting further out?

34 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

35 Are you speaking of the AEDs versus the modern defibrillators or
36 just in general?

37
38 **LEG. SUNDERMAN:**

39 I'm talking both. I mean, I don't see -- I'm confused why we would
40 wait longer to replace equipment that's antiquated. And I'm not
41 saying they're not good equipment, I tend to agree with you. But
42 knowing what we know and not being supported by Physio, that why
43 wouldn't we -- or Stryker now, why wouldn't we buy this stuff
44 earlier on instead of waiting over a three-year period?

46 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

47 That's a fiscal issue that I really -- I can't speak to. We asked
48 for a three-year -- let me just check with my expert here. Who put
49 it to four?

50
51 **UNKNOWN SPEAKER:**

52 The higher ups.

53
54 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

55 Okay, that was a decision made higher up in the department to
56 extend the request over four years, I believe, because of the

1 relatively significant amount of money that was involved.

2
3 **LEG. SUNDERMAN:**

4 But police officers are mostly on the scene first, you know, in
5 most neighborhoods, and you have MedCAT officers that are utilizing
6 these Lifepak 12s which will be 15s. I really would like to see
7 this readdressed. I support this fully, but I think we need to
8 have top-notch of equipment provided for our residents that are in
9 the communities that we serve and protect. Could we please bring
10 that back?

13 Sure, absolutely.

36 Hey. Good morning, Inspector. Just a quick question for you.
37 The new defibs that you're phasing in, how are they going to be
38 deployed? Is every precinct/MedCAT unit going to get 'em, or is it
39 a roll-in kind of in-service/out of service procedure?

41 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

42 We don't know the details of that yet primarily because we haven't
43 really decided what unit is the best one to get. Unfortunately --
44 this Lifepak 500 was just a wonderful unit and really well adapted
45 to public safety use; unfortunately they discontinued that and they
46 kind of left a hole there. The AEDs now are either more expensive
47 and more capable, so to speak, than the 500. Like they're offering
48 the 1000 which can do more stuff but is more expensive, or they
49 have a model called a CR-2 and many of the manufacturers have
50 models that, while less expensive, are not as durable. So we are
51 kicking that around and looking at all the different units, which
52 has been hindered by the fact that we can't actually go in person
53 and look at them.

55 But anyway, that would be governed by -- by where we would get
56 them; we would try to set it so that one command at a time gets it.

1 So say we -- say we get the 160 the first year, which is what we're
2 asking right now, we would -- we might do like three precincts with
3 that, and then as we get them we'll do Marine Bureau once and then
4 we'll do Highway once. Because they're -- I suspect that there's
5 going to be some kind of change where it may end up being a
6 different manufacturer, it may end up being different kind of pads.
7 So we want to keep that as homogeneous as possible so that, you
8 know, you don't have a command, a precinct, for example, where one
9 car has a Lifepak 500 and one car has a different manufacturer, a
10 different model of Lifepak and they don't operate the same. So a
11 relief police officer coming in from a different car every day or
12 two is not going to have to say *Oh Gosh, I'm using this one and not*
13 *this one today*, so. But I guess the short answer is we don't quite
14 know, but the real answer is, we'll do it in the smartest answer
15 that we can to keep the most commonality within a group of people
16 who work together so that they don't have to worry about operating
17 two different units.

18
19 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

20 Yeah, I think that was kind of just my concern. You know, the
21 MedCAT Program is pretty successfully. You know, I've worked with
22 the MedCAT officers in the 1st for a number of years and I know
23 that having the different types of defibs out there can be a little
24 challenging, so. You know, I would certainly support a Capital
25 Project to try and get it uniform across the board for the 1st
26 through the 7th so that everybody's using the same defib, you know,
27 in the MedCAT car. Thank you so much.

28
29 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

30 Oh, you're welcome. Thank you.

31
32 **P.O. CALARCO:**

33 Okay. Thank you, Legislator Donnelly. Does anybody else have any
34 other questions? Legislator Gonzalez, go ahead.

35
36 **LEG. GONZALEZ:**

37 I just wanted to add, if I'm the individual that's lying on that
38 floor and you're answering that phone call and I have the squad car
39 that's there, the first one, I want the best possible equipment
40 working on my heart, on my body that Suffolk County can measure.

41
42 I also agree with Legislator Donnelly, you know, all across the
43 board it should be the same thing. I think a life is too
44 important. And to have something that maybe fails along the way
45 because it's not the right amount of money and then all of a sudden
46 it turns around and goes back and now they're suing the Suffolk
47 County Police Department, Suffolk County, it's going to cost us a
48 lot more than one defibrillator price. So that's my two cents.
49 Again, I want the best, and I'm sure that our Presiding Officer, if
50 they were working on him, he would want the best equipment as
51 well --

52
53 **P.O. CALARCO:**
54 *(Laughter)*.

1 **LEG. GONZALEZ:**

2 -- and everyone here in this meeting. Thank you.

3
4 **P.O. CALARCO:**

5 Thank you, Legislator Gonzalez. Now you've given us four cents.

6
7 (**Laughter**)

8
9 Legislator Spencer.

11 **LEG. SPENCER:**

12 The other thing I think we should look into is with some of the
13 medi-centers and the hospitals, they have an ongoing contract with
14 these companies that not only do they maintain the equipment, as
15 new equipment comes on-line they automatically get that equipment.
16 And I really think for our MedCAT unit that should be something
17 that it's automatic. And I don't know what the cost of that is,
18 but because it's an ongoing sort of relationship, it's not as
19 expensive as you think. And we don't have to worry about it, we
10:11AM 20 know that we're getting the latest up-to-date unit, that they're
21 serviced, they automatically change out the batteries and you're
22 not getting it ever to useful life. But we deserve something like
23 that.

24
25 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

26 Well, we have had in the past service contracts on the Lifepak 12s
27 when they were available, but they -- they do end up incurring
28 expense. And what you're speaking of in general is more like a
29 lease program where you're just -- or you can call it support by
10:12AM 30 the hour if you were talking helicopter engines but we're not.
31 But something like that, that certainly does get predictability
32 that you know each year what your total costs are going to be, but
33 it also does get expensive.

34
35 **LEG. SPENCER:**

36 Could I ask for the department to do an assessment after we pass
37 this of maybe presenting to us the cost of us being in a lease
38 program? I don't like leasing things and, again, I like to do as
39 much work, and especially now, I understand the fiscal crisis.
10:13AM 40 But if there's something that should be leased where we don't have
41 to worry about it, this is something. And if we compare the
42 ongoing cost, it may not be as bad as we think it is.

43
44 **DEPUTY INSPECTOR BLOSSER:**

45 Sure. In fact, we have a good opportunity; we can ask the AED
46 manufacturers to quote it both ways --

47

38 All right. Legislator Spencer is raising his hand, though.

39 Yes, Doc.

41 **LEG. SPENCER:**

42 This I think this goes out to Lance. And I've been looking into
43 this, especially with the Capital Projects on the agenda, and I've
44 been questioning a lot of the Capital Project priority rankings.
45 And I have been looking at the process. Who makes the decision or
46 who does the grading for this; is this done by BRO?

47

48 **DIRECTOR REINHEIMER:**

10:17AM 49 The grading is done either by the County Executive or Budget Review
50 using a matrix of questions that were established many years ago.

51 I can provide you with the document that is used to answer various
52 questions that weight the answers to those questions to come up
53 with a final ranking of the project. It was many years ago, it has
54 not been updated in quite a few years.

55

56

1 **LEG. SPENCER:**

2 I don't think I could have a better opportunity to state this as
3 when we're looking at Resolution 1378.

4
5 **DIRECTOR REINHEIMER:**

6 Right.

7
8 **LEG. SPENCER:**

9 And I think that when -- you know, I've just been kind of going
10 with it because I haven't had enough information, but I want to say
11 this on the record, I want to say this publicly. With regards to
12 our priority rankings, when we see that replacement of life-saving
13 cardiac equipment gets a priority ranking of 47, that system is
14 broken.

15
16 **DIRECTOR REINHEIMER:**

17 Yes.

18
19 **LEG. GONZALEZ:**

20 Yes.

21
22 **LEG. SPENCER:**

23 And if we -- I need to, you know, work with you or whatever, but
24 when you see bathrooms rank more than replacing cardiac equipment,
25 something is wrong. So please work with me. That's got to change
26 right away. That to me is unacceptable. You know, it ranked low
27 and I'm seeing other things getting rankings of 58 and 59 for
28 different things, but there's something that's wrong with the
29 priority ranking system.

30
31 **DIRECTOR REINHEIMER:**

32 Yeah. And when that was developed many years ago, the Legislature
33 had come up with the priorities to develop that form. As I said,
34 it hasn't been updated in many years and, you know, the Legislature
35 can revisit that during the capital process and come up with
36 something that may be -- or is more reflective of the wishes and
37 desires of funding projects.

38
39 And I just want to say on 1378 also, the \$275,000 for that
40 equipment was what is scheduled in the Capital Program. If you
41 wish to purchase more equipment in, like you said, upfront the
42 defibrillators, you would have had to appropriate more funds by
43 amending the Capital Program using an offset from another Capital
44 Project. So by using the whole \$175,000 today, it doesn't stop you
45 from appropriating funds later in the year for the defibrillators,
46 but you could use another Capital Project that perhaps is not going
47 forward this year and use those appropriations and amend the
48 Capital Program.

49
50 **LEG. SPENCER:**

51 Well, thank you for that. I do think, especially now when we are
52 really scrutinizing our Capital Projects, that a lot of us are
53 reading these resolutions or trying to have some way that we can
54 sort of prioritize. And either I think we need to take those
55 numbers off, I think they're very deceptive. And, you know, just
56 as Majority Leader, looking at these different things they -- to me

1 they are more of a confusion than help us make the appropriate
2 decisions that we need.

3
4 **DIRECTOR REINHEIMER:**

5 Okay. And what I will do at your request is I will send a copy of
6 that ranking document to all the members of the Public Safety
7 Committee so that you understand what we're looking at, what we
8 discussed today.

9
10 **P.O. CALARCO:**

11 Lance, why don't you send it to everybody.

12
13 **LEG. GONZALEZ:**

14 Yes, please.

15
16 **P.O. CALARCO:**

17 And it looks like Doc has volunteered himself for a task that,
18 quite honestly, in my almost 19 years here we've never paid
19 attention to the priority rankings because it's such an outdated
20 system. But I have a whole list of people who want to speak to it
21 now; so Legislator Donnelly, you're next.

22
23 **LEG. SPENCER:**

24 Oh, no (*laughter*); I keep causing trouble.

25
26 **P.O. CALARCO:**

27 We would have been done 20 minutes ago, Doc.

28
29 (**Laughter**)

30
31 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

32 Probably just similar to what we did last year under then Presiding
33 Officer Gregory, Rob, is to maybe consider doing an ad hoc
34 committee to look at the Public Safety capital work. You know, I
35 know last year we just focused on FRES, DuWayne and I focused on
36 FRES and you and Al Krupski and several others, you know, we did
37 some work on that. That might be a good thing to do in terms of
38 trying to work with the various law enforcement entities to look at
39 their Capital Projects and their capital priorities. And then at
40 the same time, Doc can kind of look into the priority ranking
41 system and maybe bring it up to, you know, a more current kind of
42 level that might be more reflective of where we are today.

43
44 **P.O. CALARCO:**

45 Sounds like a potential strategy; I'll talk to you about that
46 later, Legislator Donnelly.

47
48 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

49 Sure.

50
51 **P.O. CALARCO:**

52 Legislator Gonzalez.

53
54 **LEG. GONZALEZ:**

55 Which is actually the same thing Legislator Donnelly just said.
56 Listen, I'm relatively still new, but I just wanted to know what

1 would be the procedure, and I think the idea that Legislator
2 Donnelly presented is absolutely the way to go, I think. But yeah,
3 a committee should be done to oversee, you know, to look at these
4 rankings which we have been talking about, especially Legislator
5 Spencer, for some time.

6
7 **P.O. CALARCO:**
8 Okay.

9

11 That's my two cents in there, sir.

14 No, Sammy, it's a dime now.

29 You're correct, it's 275.
