1 (*The meeting was called to order at 9:43 a.m. *)

2
3 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

4 Good morning, everybody, and welcome to the June 18th meeting of
5 the Legislature's Public Safety Committee. I'd ask you to all
6 please rise for a salute to the flag led by Legislator Hahn.

7
8 ***Salutation***

9
10 Please remain standing for a moment of silence as we continue to
11 allow our nation to heal from the divide that it has suffered over
12 this last several weeks. Please say a silent prayer for all those
13 innocent victims who've died as a result of racism, as well as we
14 pray for all our First Responders throughout our nation who
15 continue to keep our community safe. And as always, please say a
16 prayer for the men and women of our Armed Forces serving both here
17 and abroad.

19 ***Moment of Silence Observed***

20
21 Thank you. Be seated.

22
23 So good morning, everybody. Welcome to this June 18th meeting of
24 the Legislature's Public Safety Committee. We do not have a Public
25 Portion today, so we're going to go right to the agenda.
26 No presentations and no appointments.

27
28 We'll start with ***Tabled Resolutions***. We have two Tabled
29 Resolutions on the agenda for this morning and it's Resolution
30 ***1024(-2020) - that's Directing the Suffolk County Sheriff's Office***
31 ***to post certain signage outside of interview rooms at correctional***
32 ***facilities (Gonzalez)***.

33
34 **LEG. GONZALEZ:**

35 I'm going to continue to table that.

36
37 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

38 At the request by the sponsor, Legislator Gonzalez requests a
39 tabling motion. I'll make a motion to table.

40
41 **LEG. SPENCER:**

42 Second.

43
44 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

45 Second by Legislator Spencer. All in favor of the tabling motion?

46
47 **MS. ELLIS:**

48 *Ten.*

49
50 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

51 ***Approved (VOTE: 10-0-0-0).***

52
53 Just as a point; Amy, do you want to call a roll call or just as we
54 normally do it?

1 **MS. ELLIS:**

2 It's up to you; you could do voice votes and then I can call.

3
4 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

5 Whatever is going to help --

6
7 **P.O. CALARCO:**

8 Since we're all in the room we can just do voice votes as we used
9 to; only roll calls when Legislators are requesting one.

10
11 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

12 Okay. Thank you, Mr. Presiding Officer.

13
14 So moving along, we have a second Tabled Resolution, Resolution
15 **1285(-2020) - Appropriating funds in connection with Improvements**
16 **to the County Correctional Facility C - 141- Riverhead (CP 3014)**
17 **(County Executive)**. I'm going to make a motion to table, seconded
18 by Presiding Officer Calarco, at the request of the Sheriff. All
19 in favor of the tabling motion? Approved -- opposed? Abstentions?
20

21 **MS. ELLIS:**

22 *Ten.*

23
24 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

25 Thank you. So moved (*Approved - VOTE: 10-0-0-0*).

26
27 We're going to ***Introductory Resolutions***. Introductory Resolution
28 **1478(-2020) - Accepting an unconditional gift from Catastrophe**
29 **Master Restoration of sanitizing Suffolk County Police Department**
30 **Sixth Precinct vehicles (County Executive)**.
31

32 **LEG. SUNDERMAN:**

33 (*Raised hand*).

34
35 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

36 Motion to approve by Legislator Sunderman.

37
38 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

39 On the motion?

40
41 **P.O. CALARCO:**

42 Second.

43
44 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

45 Seconded by Legislator Calarco. And on the motion, Legislator
46 Hahn.

47
48 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

49 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I see we have Lieutenant Calandrillo.
50 Good morning. Thank you for being here.

51
52 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

53 Good morning.

1 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

2 So this is a gift of sanitizing the Police Department 6th Precinct
3 vehicles. So if you can just explain a little bit about what
4 they're going to do and what precautions you're taking when we give
5 -- what precautions -- types of precautions, you maybe don't have
6 to be entirely specific, but assure us that you're taking
7 precautions when we have an organization that we contract with and
8 give them access to all of our vehicles.

9
10 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

11 In this case, this is a local vendor that's -- I believe he's in
12 Selden. He reached out to the 6th Precinct, he made an offer to
13 clean their cars because he wanted to donate to the community, they
14 accepted the offer. These services were rendered. At the time we
15 had an officer present for all cleaning that was done, so they were
16 never in possession of these vehicles, the vehicles were cleaned
17 on-site.

18
19 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

20 Excellent. So I just wanted that, again, on the record that we're
21 taking those kinds of precautions. Thank you.

22
23 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

24 You got it. Absolutely.

25
26 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

27 Good. Anybody else? So we have a motion and a second, Amy?

28
29 **MS. ELLIS:**

30 Yes.

31
32 **LEG. SPENCER:**

33 On the motion.

34
35 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

36 Legislator Spencer, I'm sorry.

37
38 **LEG. SPENCER:**

39 With regards to the vehicles in general, is there a sanitizing
40 process after shifts that's occurring outside of this?

41
42 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

43 We're -- we acquired a machine, it's called a Decon-7 and we've
44 been cleaning the cars at Headquarters periodically. The officers
45 in the precincts are doing their own disinfecting of the computers,
46 the radio, anything that's commonly touched by other officers
47 in-between shifts.

48
49 **LEG. SPENCER:**

50 Are officers currently in the vehicles alone or are they with their
51 partners still?

52
53 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

54 Most officers -- you know, most cars out here are single cars.
55 We are doing some field training at this point, so there are units
56 that are doubled up right now while they're field training the

1 recruits that recently graduated from the academy.

2
3 **LEG. SPENCER:**

4 With those recruits, it's a little far afield but it just gives me
5 some perspective since it opened the line of questioning. Those --
6 when they're in the car together, how do they protect each other?
7 Do they wear a mask while in the car together to prevent spread?
8 That's definitely one of the -- in a closed vehicle, would be
9 definitely a high-risk of spread.

10
11 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

12 Yes. By design I believe they're wearing masks in the car.
13 I would have to check with the precincts on that, but I believe
14 that's the way it's designed when they're doubled.

15
16 **LEG. SPENCER:**

17 Okay. All right, I don't need to go any further, but just I
18 thought that would be an important thing to understand. Thank you.

19
20 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

21 Thank you, Legislator Spencer. Anybody else? Okay, so we have a
22 motion and a second. All in favor? Opposed? Abstentions?

23
24 **MS. ELLIS:**

25 *Ten.*

26
27 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

28 The motion is carried (*Approved - VOTE: 10-0-0-0*).

29
30 Resolution No. *1479(-2020) - Accepting the donation of KN95 masks*
31 *from LanRover Network Services, Inc. For use by the Suffolk County*
32 *Police Department (County Executive).*

33
34 **LEG. FLEMING:**

35 Motion.

36
37 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

38 Motion by Legislator Fleming to approve. Seconded by Legislator
39 Sunderman. Anybody on the motion? All in favor? Opposed?
40 Abstentions?

41
42 **MS. ELLIS:**

43 *Ten.*

44
45 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

46 Motion is carried. (*Approved - VOTE: 10-0-0-0*).

47
48 Resolution *1501(-2020) - Accepting an unconditional gift from*
49 *Nationwide Sales & Service Inc. Of face masks, disinfectant and*
50 *nitrile gloves (County Executive).* Motion --

51
52 **LEG. FLEMING:**

53 I'll make the motion.

54
55 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

56 -- from Legislator Fleming.

1 **LEG. GONZALEZ:**

2 *(Raised hand).*

3
4 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

5 Seconded by Legislator Gonzalez. Anybody on the motion?

6
7 **LEG. SPENCER:**

8 Yes, Mr. Chair.

9
10 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

11 Legislator Spencer.

12
13 **LEG. SPENCER:**

14 Thank you. This is to Counsel. I notice on these resolutions,
15 Counsel, that 1478 included the word *unconditional*, but 1479 did
16 not and 14 -- 1501 does. What's the difference between -- you
17 know, I assume that none of these gifts, by the nature of it being
18 a gift, that they're all unconditional. Why is the word included
19 in some resolutions and not? Is there anything that's required
20 when that word is not mentioned and what's the significant of that
21 word?

22
23 **MS. SIMPSON:**

24 Frequently we will add the word *unconditional gift* so that it is
25 very clear that there are no specific strings tied to acceptance of
26 the gift. So we've had situations where we receive a gift of say
27 property with the Vanderbilt but we have to maintain it as a museum
28 or else that gift reverts back to the owner; this there is no
29 condition on the gift itself.

30
31 These three resolutions, they list one -- two of them are
32 unconditional gift and one of them is a donation. I didn't draft
33 them, but essentially they're the same to me.

34
35 **LEG. SPENCER:**

36 Thank you.

37
38 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

39 Anybody else? No. So we have a motion and a second.
40 All in favor? Opposed? Abstentions?

41
42 **MS. ELLIS:**

43 *Ten.*

44
45 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

46 Motion is carried *(Approved - VOTE: 10-0-0-0)*.

47
48 Resolution No. *1502(-2020) - Accepting the donation of disposable*
49 *face masks from Ring for use by the Suffolk County Police*
50 *Department (County Executive)*. Motion from Legislator Spencer.

51
52 **LEG. SPENCER:**

53 Second.

54
55 **D.P.O. HAHN:**

56 Second.

1 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**
2 Seconded by Legislator Hahn. Anybody on the motion? All in favor?
3 Opposed? Abstentions?

4
5 **MS. ELLIS:**
6 *Ten.*

7
8 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**
9 Motion is carried (*Approved - VOTE: 10-0-0-0*).

10
11 Resolution No. *1520(-2020) - Extending the reporting deadline for*
12 *the Police Headquarters Task Force (Flotteron)*. Legislator
13 Flotteron, your pleasure?

14
15 **LEG. FLOTTERON:**
16 I'll make a motion to approve.

17
18 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**
19 Motion to approve by Legislator Flotteron.

20
21 **LEG. FLEMING:**
22 Second.

23
24 **LEG. SPENCER:**
25 Second.

26
27 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**
28 Seconded by Legislator Spencer. Anybody on the motion?
29 All in favor? Opposed? Abstentions?

30
31 **MS. ELLIS:**
32 *Ten.*

33
34 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**
35 Motion is carried (*Approved - VOTE: 10-0-0-0*).

36
37 We do not have any Procedural Motions, no Home Rule Messages.
38 There's no Executive Session. Anybody else have anything?
39 Legislator Richberg, yes, sir.

40
41 **LEG. RICHBERG:**
42 I just have a quick question for Lieutenant Calandrillo.

43
44 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**
45 By all means, go ahead.

46
47 **LEG. RICHBERG:**
48 So, Lieutenant, how many Explorer Programs do we have in the
49 County? Are they operated in all --

50
51 **P.O. CALARCO:**
52 You have to put the mic right up to you.

53
54 **LEG. RICHBERG:**
55 Sorry. How many Explorer Programs do we have in the County?

56

1 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

2 We have seven programs, one in each precinct.

3
4 **LEG. RICHBERG:**

5 Okay. And how many PAL officers do we have as well?

6
7 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

8 We currently have three officers assigned to PAL.

9
10 **LEG. RICHBERG:**

11 Okay. Are they spaced out throughout the County or are they --

12
13 **LIEUTENANT CALANDRILLO:**

14 That I'd have to check on. I believe they're spaced out throughout
15 the County and each one runs a different sports program.

16
17 **LEG. RICHBERG:**

18 Okay. All right, thank you very much. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

19
20 **CHAIRMAN DONNELLY:**

21 Of course.

22
23 Anybody else, any questions or comments? Seeing none, I'll take a
24 motion by Legislator Hahn to adjourn. I will second. All in
25 favor? Opposed? Abstentions? We are adjourned. Thank you,
26 Mr. Presiding Officer.
