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**LOCAL EMERGENCY ORDER No. 126 EXTENDING LOCAL EMERGENCY ORDER Nos. 50, 54, 58, 62, 66, 70, 74, 78, 82, 86, 90, 94, 98, 102, 106, 110, 114, 118 AND 122 UNDER § 24 OF ARTICLE 2-B OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW**

Local Emergency Order:

**Extending the date for the submission and adoption of the County's Proposed Capital Program**

I, Steven Bellone, the Chief Executive of Suffolk County, in accordance with a Proclamation of a State of Emergency issued on March 12, 2020 and continued on April 11, 2020; May 11, 2020; June 10, 2020; July 10, 2020; August 9, 2020; and September 8, 2020 pursuant to Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law and my power thereunder to suspend any local laws, ordinances, or regulations, do hereby:

Order, that due to the continuing threat to the public health, safety and welfare of Suffolk County residents and visitors posed by Covid-19 and the resultant diversion of County resources and personnel, Local Emergency Order Nos. 50, 54, 58, 62, 66, 70, 74, 78, 82, 86, 90, 94, 98, 102, 106, 110, 114, 118 and 122 are extended by continuing the suspension of the date for the submission and adoption of the County's Proposed Capital Program as follows:

Section C4-16 of the Suffolk County Charter requiring submission of a proposed capital program and related documents to the County Legislature on or before the 15th day of April is further suspended and such submission shall run concurrent with the submission of the proposed budget, consisting of the proposed expense budget and proposed capital budget pursuant to § C4-6 of the Suffolk County Charter; and


Section C4-18 of the Suffolk County Charter requiring that the County Legislature hold at least one public hearing on the proposed capital program not later than the 15th day of May shall be suspended and alternatively, such public hearing shall be combined with and held as set forth in § C4-9 of the Suffolk County Charter; and


Section C4-19 of the County Charter regarding adoption of the Capital Program not less than two weeks after the public hearing required by § C4-18 and not later than the 30th day of June is hereby suspended and alternatively, such adoption shall be combined with and run concurrent with the timeframes set forth in §§ C4-10 and C4-11 of the Suffolk County Charter; and further

Order, that all Suffolk County Departments, Agencies, and Divisions or other duly authorized law enforcement agencies take whatever steps are necessary to assist in performing such emergency measures as deemed necessary; and further order that

This order shall cease to be in effect five (5) days after promulgation or upon declaration by the County Executive that the state of emergency no longer exists, whichever occurs sooner. The County Executive nevertheless, may extend such orders for additional periods not to exceed five (5) days each during the pendency of the local state of emergency. Failure to obey this order is a criminal offense, punishable by law under New York State Executive Law § 24 (5).
