LOCAL EMERGENCY ORDER No. 149 EXTENDING LOCAL EMERGENCY ORDER No. 131, 136, 141 and 145 UNDER § 24 OF ARTICLE 2-B OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW

Local Emergency Order:

Extending the date for the submission and adoption of the County's Proposed Capital Program

I, Steven Bellone, the Chief Executive of Suffolk County, in accordance with a Proclamation of a State of Emergency issued on March 12, 2020 and continued on April 11, 2020; May 11, 2020; June 10, 2020; July 10, 2020; August 9, 2020; September 8, 2020; and October 8, 2020 pursuant to Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law and my power thereunder to suspend any local laws, ordinances, or regulations, do hereby:

Order, that due to the continuing threat to the public health, safety and welfare of Suffolk County residents and visitors posed by Covid-19 and the resultant diversion of County resources and personnel, Local Emergency Order Nos. 131, 136, 141 and 145 are extended and the date for the submission and adoption of the County's Proposed Capital Program is amended as follows:

Section C4-16 of the Suffolk County Charter requiring submission of a proposed capital program and related documents to the County Legislature on or before the 15th day of April is further suspended and such submission shall be filed on September 18, 2020; and


Section C4-18 of the Suffolk County Charter requiring that the County Legislature hold at least one public hearing on the proposed capital program not later than the 15th day of May is hereby modified to require at least one public hearing on the proposed capital program not later than the 15th day of October; and


Section C4-19 of the County Charter regarding adoption of the Capital Program not less than two weeks after the public hearing required by § C4-18 and not later than the 30th day of June is hereby modified to require the adoption of the Capital Program not later than the 16th day of November; and further

Order, that all Suffolk County Departments, Agencies, and Divisions or other duly authorized law enforcement agencies take whatever steps are necessary to assist in performing such emergency measures as deemed necessary; and further order that

This order shall cease to be in effect five (5) days after promulgation or upon declaration by the County Executive that the state of emergency no longer exists, whichever occurs sooner. The County Executive nevertheless, may extend such orders for additional periods not to exceed five (5) days each during the pendency of the local state of emergency. Failure to obey this order is a criminal offense, punishable by law under New York State Executive Law § 24 (5).

PROCLAMATION 2020-08

PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY
UNDER SECTION 24 OF ARTICLE 2-B OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW

A **State of Emergency** is hereby proclaimed to continue in Suffolk County, New York for a period of time beginning at 12:01 a.m. on October 8, 2020 and continuing in effect for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days.


The State of Emergency has been declared to address the continuing threat to the health and welfare of Suffolk County residents and visitors posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, which United States Health and Human Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II declared a public health emergency for the entire United States, and to perform such emergency measures as deemed necessary.

Such conditions threaten or imperil the public safety of the citizens of the County of Suffolk.

As **Chief Executive of Suffolk County, I, Steven Bellone**, have exercised the authority given to me under New York State Executive Law, Article 2-B, to preserve the public safety and hereby render all required and available assistance vital to the security, well-being, health and property of the citizens of the community.

I hereby direct all Suffolk County Departments, Agencies, and Divisions to take whatever steps are necessary to protect life and property, and public infrastructure, and to perform other such emergency assistance as deemed necessary.
