

Due to public health and safety concerns related to COVID-19 and pursuant to Executive Order 202.1, extended by Executive Orders 202.14, 202.28, 202.38, 202.48, 202.55, 202.60, 202.67, 202.72, 202.79, 202.87, 202.92, 202.95 202.97, 202.98, 202.99, 202.103, 202.108, 202.109 and 202.110 the County Legislature's Public Hearings will be held both in person and via Zoom on June 22 at 6:30 pm. In accordance with county and state COVID-19 safety protocols, members of the public who wish to provide in-person testimony may do so after having a temperature check upon entry into our building. Visitors who are vaccinated against COVID-19 and who are willing to provide proof of vaccination, if requested, will not be required to wear a mask while inside our building. Those who are not vaccinated or who do not wish to disclose their vaccination status will be required to wear a mask at all times while inside the building. Inside the Rose Caracappa Auditorium, there will be designated seating areas for vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals.
